#### Important Term Dates

Term 1 ends on **Wednesday, November 1st.** Report cards will be distributed to students on Thursday, **November 16th**, during Bulldog Block.

The deadline to make-up incomplete grades is November 15th. Please refer to the Handbook rules below if this applies to you.

Incomplete Grades:

- Students have two weeks from the day grades close to make up any Incomplete Grades issued by teachers, including 4th term and the summer.
- All work not completed within the specified period will be given no credit and averaged with the completed work to determine a grade.
- In the case of extenuating circumstances, any extension of this policy must be arranged with the Principal before the end of the two-week time period.

#### Attention Seniors - Yellow Sheets Due, October 31st

Students with a November 15th deadline should return all yellow sheets to Guidance by October 31st.

#### Financial Aid Information for Seniors

Over 200 private colleges require the CSS Profile. The CSS Profile is available now and can be found at <u>https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org/</u>. Colleges have deadlines for financial aid applications, including the CSS Profile. Please check your schools to see if they require the CSS Profile and the timeline for submission.

#### SAT Information for Juniors and Seniors

Are you planning on taking the SAT? Reminder: **Nov 2nd** is the deadline to register for the **Dec 2nd** test. Students register using their College Board accounts at <u>SAT College Board Registration</u>. Reminder - fee waivers are available in guidance for eligible students.

#### **AP Payments DUE THIS WEEK**

AP Exam down payments are due by <u>Friday, November 3rd.</u> The non-refundable payment amount is \$40 per exam. Payments can be made by check or cash and will be accepted in the Guidance office. The full cost per exam is \$98 with the exception of Seminar and Research, which are \$146 per exam. If you miss the deadline, an additional <u>\$40 per exam late fee</u> will be added to your exam cost.

If you qualify for Free or Reduced lunch and would like to apply for a waiver, you must contact Guidance prior to Friday, November 2nd, for approval. Students that are approved for a waiver will be responsible for a payment of \$15 per exam, due by November 2nd, to avoid the \$40 per exam late fee.
