Important Term Dates

Term 1 ends on **Wednesday, November 1st.** Report cards will be distributed to students on Wednesday, **November 15th**, during Bulldog Block.

The deadline to make-up incomplete grades is November 15th. Please refer to the Handbook rules below if this applies to you.

Incomplete Grades:

- Students have two weeks from the day grades close to make up any Incomplete Grades issued by teachers, including 4th term and the summer.
- All work not completed within the specified period will be given no credit and averaged with the completed work to determine a grade.
- In the case of extenuating circumstances, any extension of this policy must be arranged with the Principal before the end of the two-week time period.

Attention Seniors - Yellow Sheets Due, October 18th

Students who are applying to schools with a **November 1st** deadline should return all yellow sheets to Guidance by **October 18th**. Students with a **November 15th** deadline, should return all yellow sheets to Guidance by **October 31st**.

Virtual College Fairs for Juniors and Seniors, Now through November 12th


