How to Gather District Data for Timely Completion

The Civil Rights Data Collection (CRDC) is a biennial survey required by the U.S. Department of Education Office. The purpose of this survey is to obtain data regarding the compliance to Civil Rights Laws in our nation's schools.

The data collection survey is completed by all public Local Educational Agencies (LEA), as well as all schools including charter schools, alternative schools, juvenile justice facilities, and schools serving students with disabilities. The collection of data information includes student enrollment, and educational programs and related services.

The CRDC is an important aspect of the Education Department's strategy for enforcing the Civil Rights statutes for which it is responsible. This year's collection will focus on data collection from the 2021-22 school year.
