Almost twenty years ago, a group of families took a risk and sent their children to a new start-up school in Union County named Arborbrook Christian Academy. Many of those parents were filling out applications for admission even before the school founders had finalized the location for the school! It was an uncertain, exciting time; it was an adventure. The vision of the kind of education Arborbrook would strive to provide was enough for those pioneer families to make a commitment and enroll.

Arborbrook opened its doors on our current campus with forty students in grades K-7.

We are in awe as we reflect on God's faithfulness over the years to grow, nurture and mature our school. We have grown significantly in size with 268 students enrolled in 2023. Our scope has expanded; we are now a K-12 school and even offer college courses through our dual enrollment program. Time has tested and seasoned our educational philosophy and the distinctives envisioned by our founders – the Gayles, Grems,



NC Expands Opportunity Scholarship Next School Year

More families will qualify for publicly funded private school vouchers under an expansion of the state's Opportunity Scholarship program for the 2024-2025 school year.

The Opportunity Scholarship program currently serves mostly low-income families and some middle-income families, providing applicants with a voucher to help pay for private school tuition for their children. The expansion will make families of all incomes eligible for the voucher. This legislation will be a game changer for NC families seeking private education for their children.

Look for more information about this program soon. Arborbrook will equip current families with information needed to apply for these funds. Applications begin in February 2024.
