The 2nd Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:



2nd Grade teachers will send home weekly grade-level comprehension passages.



2nd grade teachers will send home standards based math practice in homework binders weekly.



2nd grade teachers will provide students with 45 minute sessions of weekly i-ready practice in both reading and math.
