# Our Goals for Student Achievement



## District Goals:

1. Improved Lexile Levels, College & Career Readiness Index Scores (CCRPI), & Georgia Milestone Assessment (GMAS) scores
  - \*reading on grade level and mathematical competency
2. Observation of more rigorous instruction, increased implementation of STEAM and project based learning activities
  - \*problem solving & critical thinking



## HHES 4th Grade Goals:

1. 4th graders will increase the percentage of students scoring on-grade level or above on Reading GMAS at the end of the year from 76% to 81%.
2. 4th graders will increase the percentage of students scoring proficient or above on Math GMAS at the end of the year from 58% to 65%.

## Teachers, Parents, Students- Working Together for Success

### In the 4th Grade Classroom

The 4th Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:



4th grade teachers will send home weekly reading comprehension passages to reinforce skills taught in class.



4th grade teachers will provide weekly Math fact fluency practice to reinforce skills taught in class.



4th grade teachers will communicate throughout the year using Class Dojo, weekly newsletters, and Tuesday folders.

### At Home

4th grade parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success in Reading and Math



4th grade parents will model reading and hold their children accountable for reading 20 minutes each night by asking questions for comprehension.



Parents will review/practice multiplication facts with their children for 20-30 minutes daily.



Parents will check Tuesday folders and Class Dojo for important information and weekly reminders.



### 4th Grade Students

Students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students shared the following ideas:



4th grade students will read 20 minutes each night to help increase reading comprehension.



4th grade students will master multiplication and division fact fluency 1-12.



4th grade students will get Tuesday folders signed each week and share information in folders with parents.



**Teachers, Parents, and Students believe these additional key points will create success for our 4th Graders this year:**

1. Get plenty of rest each night.
2. Have a quiet place to read.
3. Follow classroom and school rules.
4. Treat classmates and teachers with respect.
