

WHAT IS CAPSTONE AT MINNETONKA HIGH SCHOOL?

The Minnetonka High School Capstone Project gives 12th grade students the opportunity to participate in a two-week, off-campus experience at the end of their senior year. This experience is designed to inspire the students to explore their interests while enhancing their educational experience at Minnetonka High School. Eligible seniors can explore a career field, service work, or a project of interest.

WHAT ARE THE GOALS OF CAPSTONE?

Through the Senior Capstone project, students are able to:

- become immersed in a field of interest under the guidance of a professional mentor
- explore a career field to gain insights into the true nature of the work
- develop and enrich their independence, self-reliance, creativity, and professional social skills
- gain valuable references for the future
- extend their thinking beyond the classroom
- interact in an adult world

WHAT IS THE ROLE OF THE PROFESSIONAL MENTOR?

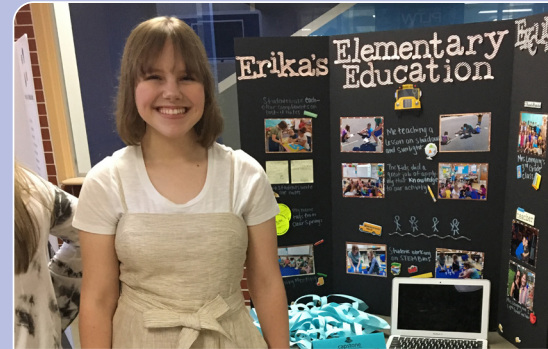
For students, the highlight of the Capstone experience is working with a mentor in a unique, real-world learning environment.

During the mentor selection process, each student will ensure that their project goals match what the prospective mentor—and their organization—can offer.

Mentors and students will:

- Meet to plan Capstone experience, agree on goals for students' project, and sign the student's application (application is due March 2, 2025)
- Mentors will offer expertise in the area of study
- Mentors will supervise students while they are off campus (May 20-30, 2025)
 - Students will spend 40+ hours on their Capstone project during these 8 days.
 - It is not necessary for students to spend every day with their mentor, however the mentor is the person overseeing the project.
- Mentors may (optionally) attend the Capstone Community Fair on in June 2025 where all Capstone students will showcase their project, answer questions and share what they learned throughout their Capstone experience. **NOTE: Full details about the culminating Capstone event are TBD**
