

Both concerts will be held at the Mynderse Academy Auditorium.







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# **CURRICULUM CORNER**

Each month information will be shared about what your child is learning in school. This will be an overview of topics being learned; please contact your child's teacher for more details as needed. If you have special talents or knowledge of a topic to be studied that you would like to share, please reach out to your child's teacher. We would love for you to share in our students' learning!

**<u>Grade 3:</u>** For Math, we will be working with Measurement and Data as we learn to tell time on analog clocks and calculate elapsed time. We will also look at the metric system, estimating and measuring mass and liquid volume. We will ROUND out the month with rounding numbers to the nearest ten and hundred! In ELA, after we wrap up our novel study of *Because of Winn Dixie* with a book-themed party, we are excited to kick off our Poetry unit with students! Students will identify parts of poems using terms such as stanza, understand and identify the difference between literal and figurative language. For Writing, we will be focusing on personal narratives. Students will write narratives to develop real or imagined experiences or events using effective techniques, descriptive details, and clear event sequences.

<u>**Grade 4:**</u> Fourth graders will be reading the novel <u>Eagle Song</u> with a focus on theme and character traits. In Social Studies students continue to learn about the Iroquois/Haudenosaunee, exploring culture and oral tradition. We continue to build student understanding of RADDI (Restate, Answer, Detail, Detail, I Connect) to respond to text. Students did a great job building understanding of Place Value and adding and subtracting multi digit numbers. We will be moving to Multiplication and Division. Please continue to practice math facts nightly!

**Grade 5:** In math, we are wrapping up our first module on adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing decimal numbers. We will be starting Module 2 that considers multi-digit whole number and decimal fractions. In ELA, we are finishing *Number the Stars* and beginning our next whole class novel unit *Esperanza Rising*. *Esperanza Rising* tells the story of a thirteen-year-old girl from Mexico who flees to the United States with her mother after a sudden family tragedy and settles in a camp for immigrant farm workers. We are beginning our first science kit, Toys Matter, where students will carry out a series of investigations working with a large variety of materials acting as engineers at a toy company. Their final challenge will be to use what they have learned to engineer a new toy!

# DATA CORNER

Did you know....

- All students completed their iReady diagnostics to start the year. 80% of our students are approaching, on or above grade level in iReady Reading and 79% in math. We can't wait to see the growth they'll make all year!
- Our daily average attendance during the first 2 months of school is 95.62% in attendance. Keep up the great work!
