German Exchange Program

Gaines joined a roster of athletes who grow in skill, experience and confidence through MUHS support and coaching. And with six no-cut sports, it's not just for those who reach the pros or the 15 seniors from the Class of 2023 who are going on to compete in college.



HANDS-ON STEM

ROBOTICS



Students thrive with hands-on experience in STEM subjects. Since forming in 2006, Hilltopper Robotics (Team 1732) has grown into an elite squad while fielding a team in collaboration with girls from Divine Savior Holy Angels High School.

In competition, teams are tasked with designing and building robots that can complete challenges, such as picking up and moving objects, navigating obstacles and working collaboratively with other teams. Hilltopper Robotics concluded its most recent season ranked in the top five percent of robotics teams in the world at the FIRST Robotics Championship in Houston.





SCIENCE OLYMPIAD

This year, Marquette High's Science Olympiad team won state and earned a trip to nationals for the third consecutive year. The team placed 11th in the nation in 2023.

The team also competes in national competitions at MIT, University of Michigan and Northwestern University. In recognition of the team's achievements, team members were featured on TMJ4 to provide demonstrations of some of the Science Olympiad competitions.

Throughout the year, students work on designing and building catapults, planes, bridges and parachutes and learn about the natural world, from the behavior of electrical currents, or the structure of essential proteins.

MUHS Science Olympiad alumni have attended school at Caltech, Stanford, Yale, Notre Dame, Northwestern and other top science and engineering schools.

THE ARTS

If you take a tour of the hallways under the O'Rourke Performing Arts Hall, you'll find spray-painted names and mementos of students going back to the 1960s. This is a testament to everyone who leaves a mark on plays, musicals and the beloved tradition of Senior Follies. At Marquette High, students are prepared to be creative and critical thinkers, artists, participants and patrons of the arts.

Students can take visual arts courses like 2D Design, 3D Design, Drawing, Photography, Painting, or Ceramics. There are also performing arts courses like Chorus, Jazz Lab, and Computer-assisted Music.

Along with art, music, and performance classes, students have the opportunity to join Prep Players, the drama organization of the school. Students of all four grade levels can develop their interest in acting, singing, dancing, stagecraft, lighting, sound, and theater house management. The high points of the year for the Prep Players are staging and performing in the annual winter play and the spring musical. Girls from other high schools are invited to audition for these two productions. The Prep Players also help stage Senior Follies.






FAITH, SCHOLARSHIP, COMMUNITY

Marquette University High School was designated a 2021 National Blue Ribbon School by the U.S. Department of Education. MUHS was among an elite group of only 23 private schools in the country and the only Wisconsin high school so recognized in 2021. MUHS was honored in the Exemplary High Performing category for academic performance.
