BATTLE MOUNTAIN HIGH GENERAL INFORMATION

[Battle Mountain High School](#) is a public 4-year comprehensive and academically rigorous high school located in the Vail Valley of Colorado. It holds membership in the Colorado Council of High School/College Relations and is accredited with distinction by the Colorado Department of Education.

The graduating class of 2023 was 157 students and total enrollment for the 2023-2024 school year is 947 students.

The ethnic/racial composition of Battle Mountain High School is: 58% Hispanic or Latino, 39% White/Caucasian, 1.5% Multi-Racial, <1% Asian, 1% Black/African American, <1% American Indian or Alaskan Native.

BMHS has a traditional two semester/7 class period day schedule with block days on Wednesday and Thursday.

Each semester class earns .5 credits.

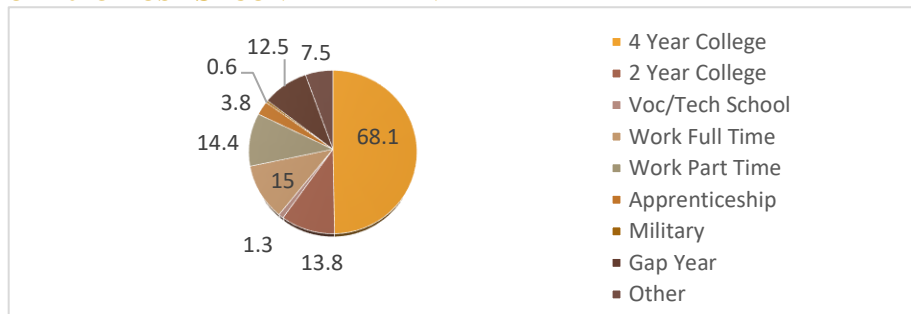
