Mount St. Dominic soccer looks to continue success in the postseason

CALDWELL – It was an exciting week for Mount St. Dominic soccer, which beat Newark East 6-1 on Saturday, Oct. 28, to win the Super Essex Conference Liberty Division championship.

The team (17-2) was led by sophomore standout Gianna Camporeale who put three goals in net and recorded an assist. Fellow sophomore scored two goals and had two assists, freshman Reina Casas had one goal and two assists and sophomore Val Somoza also joined in on the fun with an assist of her own.

Earlier in the week, the Lions suffered their second loss of the season on Monday, Oct. 23, 2-1, to Morristown, but bounced back to beat Science Park 5-0 on Thursday, Oct. 26. Five players each scored, including Casas, Camporeale, Tusche, sophomore Jacqueline Karcic and junior Abby Amaty. Junior Mary Hladik had two assists and both Camporeale and junior Lorelei Middleton also added an assist each. Senior goalie Frankie Mansfield notched two saves in the shutout win.

The Mount, the No. 2 seed, will next play in the NJSIAA North Jersey, Non Public A state quarterfinals on Tuesday, Oct. 31 versus No. 7 seed Pingry.
