# Dear Scarborough Students and Families:



# October 11: Testing Day

Wednesday, October 11, is our Fall testing day for Grades 9, 10, and 11 and our Financial Wellness Workshop for Seniors.

#### **Schedule and Logistics**

Testing for Grades 9, 10, and 11 will run from 8:00-11:15. The Senior Financial Wellness Workshop will also run from 8:00-11:15. This means neither White Blocks 1 and 2, nor Advisory/AEAST will meet on this day. After testing, we will run White Blocks 3 and 4 as regularly scheduled. Students should plan to go to their assigned lunch for a White 1 day.

Room assignments for all students (including Seniors, who will be assigned to a teacher for the Financial Wellness Workshop) are posted outside the Cafeteria and Student Services on Snacks and drinks will be provided to students during testing breaks.

This year, ALL assessments are administered through a digital platform. Paper/pencil versions will not be available. Students will need to use a school-issued Chromebook.

• School Chromebooks: If your child does not have a school issued Chromebook, they will need to pick one up from our IT Department (C103) prior to Oct. 11th. Parents: Please be sure that you have signed the Chromebook Use Policy form in PowerSchool. If you have not yet signed this form, please log into your PowerSchool Parent Portal and sign the form before Oct. 11th. Your child cannot be issued a school device until you have signed the Chromebook Use Policy.

While an 'opt out' option for these tests is not available, we do wish to partner with you in making decisions in the best interest of our students. If you have concerns regarding your child's participation, please contact either your child's School Counselor or myself.

Our expectations for attendance are the same as they are for every other day. To participate in after-school Athletic activities on this day, students are expected to be in school and on-time for all in-day school activities and classes. Any discrepancies in attendance will need to be taken care of with the teacher or Mr. Yeo, our Safety and Attendance Officer, before the end of the same school day, as the Athletic and Activities Department will follow whatever is posted in PowerSchool. To excuse an absence, parents should call 207.730.5000 and provide a reason for the absence.

#### **Testing and Activity Information**

**Freshmen** will be taking the iReady Diagnostic assessment, which is given in both the fall and the spring. The iReady Diagnostic is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions to suit each student's needs. Data from this assessment will help teachers learn more about their students, and assist teachers in better meeting student needs in the classroom. We will be in contact with ninth graders who are absent on October 11 or who need more time to complete the assessment to establish a makeup plan.

**Sophomores** will be participating in the Maine Through Year Assessment for reading and math, formerly called the Maine Educational Assessment (MEA). This State-mandated assessment is also given in both the fall and the spring. The data gained from this assessment will assist us in making improvements to our curriculum and instruction. We will be in contact with tenth graders who are absent on October 11 or who need more time to complete the assessment to establish a makeup plan.

Juniors will be taking the PSAT/NMSQT. All students who have been pre-approved for College Board testing accommodations will have access to those accommodations through the digital testing format. Approved accommodations will automatically be loaded onto your child's Chromebook by the College Board. Please note: Because the PSAT must be completed in one sitting, students who have extended time as an approved accommodation are likely to miss additional instructional time during Blocks 3 and/or 4 on October 11. Teachers have been made aware and students would be wise to check in White Blocks 3 and 4 about any missed instruction or assignment. We will offer a single make-up day on October 12, 2023. Any Junior who is absent and would like the opportunity to make-up the exam may do so on this date. The make-up exam will also be digital and will begin at 8:00am.

**Seniors** will be taking part in a Financial Workshop in coordination with Town & Country Federal Credit Union. Seniors have received an email from Mrs. Zavasnik detailing the different learning opportunities within this event. The Financial Wellness Workshop is a chance for Seniors to get insight and advice from local financial experts on budgeting, credit cards, debt, loans, etc. Seniors should bring a writing utensil to the workshop.

Saturday, October 14, is our Homecoming Dance. The Dance will take place in the SHS Cafeteria from 7:00-10:00pm.
