Early Childhood Division

From the Division Principal

Last week, Southern California Sensory Screening (SCSS) visited our Early Childhood Division to provide speech and language, vision, and hearing screenings. These screenings are an essential part of preschool programs because they help to identify developmental strengths or potential delays in children at an early stage, thereby ensuring they receive the necessary support, evaluation, or referral to address any concerns.

During the recent screening, children were tested for muscle balance, distance acuity, and near-vision acuity, depending on their age level. Speech screening was also done individually, with attention given to each child's age level, expressive language skills, articulation progress, vocal quality, and fluency.

Parent-Teacher Conferences will be held Thursday, November 16, and Friday, November 17. In preparation, we sent home the Ages & Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) for parents to fill out based on their observations at home. Observations of how children play, learn, speak, act, and move can offer important clues about their development. Teachers will conduct similar observations in the classroom.

By combining the ASQs, teacher observations, and professional screenings, we can see a complete picture of a child's developmental status and readiness for academic success.

Field Studies Week is designed to integrate information from many different content areas into hands-on learning experiences outside the classroom. The program also builds responsibility and develops cooperative learning opportunities for our students as they navigate situations that may take them out of their regular comfort zone. All trips are faculty chaperoned and an extension of the SJES classrooms.

- Sixth-grade students traveled to Pali Institute for an experiential education about our environment and to cultivate leadership skills in the local mountains.
- Seventh-grade students traveled to SEACAMP San Diego for interactive field activities related to the marine world and to foster critical-thinking skills.
