#### THE THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME NOVEMBER 5, 2023

*From Fr Eric: They tie up heavy burdens . . . and lay them on people's shoulders.* (Matthew 23:4) Today we read how Jesus accused Jerusalem's religious leaders of laying "heavy burdens" on people by imposing more and more rules on them (Matthew 23:4).

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus acknowledged the authority of the scribes and the Pharisees as the teachers of the Law. He urged the people to listen to what they teach them. One would have thought that his own confrontations with the scribes and the Pharisees would have made him present them in a bad light. In the Gospel Reading, we observe the objective and sincere attitude of Jesus in dealing with the scribes and the Pharisees. He did not deceive his audience or seek to falsely discredit the teaching of the scribes and the Pharisees.

Although Jesus sounded positive in regard to what the scribes and the Pharisees teach, he did not have the same commendation for their **own behavior**. Jesus warned his audience against following **the behavior** or **way of life of the scribes** and the Pharisees.

But their whole outlook on religion had one fundamental effect. It made it a thing of thousands upon thousands of rules and regulations; and therefore it made it an intolerable burden. Here is the test of any presentation of religion. Does it make it wings to lift a man up, or a deadweight to drag him down? Does it make it a joy or a depression? Is a man helped by his religion or is he haunted by it? Does it carry him, or has he to carry it? Whenever religion becomes a depressing affair of burdens and prohibitions, it ceases to be true religion.

The words of Paul to the Thessalonians in the Second Reading reflect the attitude Christ expected of his disciples. True service is similar to the care a mother takes of her children. Paul told the Thessalonians that his attitude toward them was like that of a mother; he was so devoted and protective of them. He did not lord it over them nor did he seek to hold a position of prestige among them. Rather, he was concerned about offering them the Good News of salvation at no cost.

Let us therefore endeavour to live the virtues Christ teaches us in the Gospels. Let us pray for the grace of humble service so that we can be found worthy of our calling to be Christian leaders. We are all leaders in one situation or the other, so we should never be found wanting in these virtues.


