

# **Early Childhood Screening Metric**

**Early Childhood Readiness Screening:** Number of 3 Year

Olds Screened during SY14-15



Over 20% increase in the number of 3 year olds screened during the 2014-15 school year compared to a year earlier.



## Screenings are important and required

#### **Screenings review:**

- Height and weight
- Vision and hearing
- Social/emotional
- Speech and other development areas


# Annually SPPS screens over 4,000 children

- 3,000 at Student Placement Center screens
- Over 1,000 at childcare centers and community sites throughout St. Paul

- Increased community engagement







## **2016 Lottery Facts**


- Completed March 31, 2016

- 1260 late applications ↑ (737 placed) ↑






## **Kindergarten Lottery Results**

- 1,772 participated
   (on-time and late)
- 79% of students placed received their first choice
- 86% of students were placed ♥
  - 256 no placement

- 60% of students placed received their 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> choice






#### **Continued Enrollment in SPPS**


