

Tour of Spaces

- Hawk's Nest
 - This dynamic space serves as a homebase for students who receive specially designed instruction with a special education case manager. The Hawk's Nest is a suite of rooms intentionally designed to provide the best level of support for students with unique learning styles. The large classroom space is used for 1:1 and small group instruction as well as for other accommodations outlined in the students IEP such as an alternate testing environment.
- Sensory Room
 - The sensory room space is located within the Hawk's Nest. This space was designed to help students regulate their sensory system(s) through the use of full spectrum dimmable LED lights, swing attachments, jumping, balancing, bouncing, spinning, weighted, deep pressure or fine motor activities.
- Elementary Quiet Room
 - The elementary quiet room space is located near the elementary classroom spaces and provides the opportunity for students to both reduce external stimuli that may be causing dysregulation to any of the sensory systems or receive input to their sensory systems for improved regulation. This space is equipped with soft furnishings and dimmable LED lights, books and calming tools.
- Middle School Quiet Room
 - The middle school quiet room was designed with the middle schooler in mind. Soft furnishings, full spectrum LED dimmable lights all provide the opportunity for students to regain regulation or have an additional space for small group work time or a quiet space for testing or work completion. This space is located within the Hawk's Nest.
- Speech and Language/Occupational Therapy
 - At Swallow School, the Speech and Language Therapist and Occupational Therapist share a room. This allows students who receive both related services to have co-treatment sessions, work in small groups or receive individual therapy.
