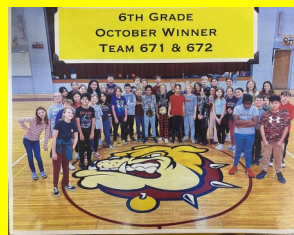
Please note that we do not have the ability to warm student lunches. Please avoid sending lunches with your child that would require heating. Thank you.

SAFETY FIRST: REMINDERS

Parents should drive AROUND the building (following the designated car lane) to drop students and pick students up in the afternoons at EXIT 2 ONLY.

All car-riders will be dismissed at Exit 2 in the afternoons and are expected to be dropped off there as well.

ALL morning drop off should happen at EXIT 2, using the car lane and driving all the way around the building. This includes choir, band and orchestra.

Students should never be let out of vehicles in the parking lot containing school bus traffic.

Crossing guards will be available to assist walkers.

Please remember that the bus and car lanes designated by identifying marks on the pavement, cones and a sign are to be observed during the hours of 7:50am-8:40am and 3:00-3:40pm for the safety of our students and staff.

There is parking available behind the gym at the back of the building if you need to enter the building during these times. Follow the car lane for this parking.

Dear Lakeview Families,

Ohio SB 288 has mandated that schools provide education/training for students on child sexual abuse and sexual violence beginning this school year. To meet this requirement Lakeview School Counselors will be presenting the "Equipped - Speak Up" course to 5th grade students and the "Empowered - Speak Up" course to 6th grade students during the first week of December.

These courses are developed by The Foundation United, a non-profit organization with the mission to end sex trafficking and exploitation through systemic change and getting at the root. The Foundation United has designed curriculum that is intended to equip students with necessary skills and knowledge to decrease the risk of sexual abuse from grades K - 12.

For both 5th & 6th grade, the course takes approximately one hour and includes a pre - test, a powerpoint presentation, and post - test.

After the 5th grade course students will be able to:

- * Define what safe and unsafe people do
- * Define intuition
- * Define gaslighting
- * Describe the difference between an unsafe secret and a surprise
- * Define the body safety rules for your body
- * Define consent
- * Define shock
- * Define and list three people who could be in your triangle of trust
- * List examples of ways to speak out if something makes you uncomfortable
- * List ways that people can be unsafe online
- * Analyze scenarios to apply key concepts and key vocabulary

After the 6th grade course students will be able to:

- * Define consent
- * Define intuition
- * Explain how shock may impact someone's initial response
- * Identify your safe adults
- * Define gaslighting and how it can be used
- * Describe risk factors or vulnerabilities that some abusers may look for
- * Describe common tactics that abusers may use
- * Describe the vulnerabilities and indicators of labor trafficking
- * Explain how technology and social media can be used by abusers
- * Describe strategies to stay safe online
- * Analyze scenarios and apply key concepts and vocabulary
