


SECOND COLLECTION NOV. 5 Archdiocese for the Military Services

ANNUAL REPORT FISCAL YEAR 2023



A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear OLGC Community,

I am pleased to share with you these highlights from last year in this 2022-2023 annual report. I want to thank our parish community for its continued loyalty and generosity as we emerge from a pandemic to post Covid. We have continued the Lenten Fish Fry (approx. 1,000 attendees per week) and hired an Events and Fellowship coordinator to bring back favorite parish activities such as Bingo Night, Fall Fest, Spaghetti Dinner, St. Nicholas Breakfast, Spring Gala, and Spring Fling with the goal to continue to build and celebrate our community and each other. We have such a vibrant community of many cultures and talents, and I am deeply grateful for each and every one in our community.

Our school continues to have full enrollment for K-8 and Preschool (over 520 students combined) and we remain thankful to our faculty, administration, and staff for their dedication and innovative classroom instruction.

The following are sacramental and ministry highlights from the past year:

- 1. 10am Sunday Mass livestream continues and reaches over 500 households.
- 2. 82 Baptisms celebrated
- 3. Over 400 students enrolled in the CCF religious education program
- 4. 130 First Communions
- 5. 103 Confirmations

We are blessed to have so many catechists and volunteers each year to help us welcome new members and assist in the religious formation and sacramental preparation of our young members.

In the Financial area, we achieved **\$8.9M** in revenues, which is a 5% increase over FY22. This reflects full enrollment at the school along with the overall resumption of school and parish activities. Operating expenses held steady at **\$7.3M** resulting in a surplus of **\$1.5M**. While over \$300K is committed to the Cornerstone campaign, the remainder will be used to help build operating cash reserves.

Other income of **\$1.9M** reflects FY23 Cornerstone campaign revenues against capital expenses of **\$1.6M**. The latter includes the completion of Phase 2 of the school HVAC system, school flooring upgrades and work on the church roof. We have spent over \$3.8M against a total CAPEX project list of \$12M. To date, we have raised \$10M. <u>Please help to close this \$2M gap with a gift or pledge to the Cornerstone campaign</u>. This is a most urgent appeal given a possible moratorium by the Bishop on local fundraising beginning 2024.

Our new parish theme, "Do all things with great love," reflects our Salesian tradition. Let us continue to work together to define that great love. With deep gratitude for your generosity and your faithful commitment to OLGC, I remain proud and honored to be your pastor.



OTC HEARING AID GUIDANCE

The FDA has published detailed guidance for people to consider before purchasing over-the-counter hearing aids without assistance from medical professionals. Statements such as "FDA Registered" and "FDA Certified" medical devices and the use of an FDA logo on hearing aid package labeling may be misleading.

The agency last year approved the direct purchase of hearing aids for adults with mild to moderate hearing loss, a move that's expected to save consumers thousands of dollars and is intended to encourage the use of hearing aids. FYI

Scientists think napping may be good for the brain. Researchers in both the US and the UK are suggesting that napping during the day could help brain function. They found an association between daytime napping and larger brain volume equivalent to people who were 2.6 to 6.5 years younger. Previous research on people over 65 suggests daytime napping improves short term cognition, with nappers outperforming non-nappers in cognitive tests. Prior studies suggest naps under 30 minutes are best, with earlier naps less likely to affect nighttime sleep. (Kiplinger's Retirement Report)


DEMENTIA CARE HELP

In an effort to improve the quality of life for people with dementia and reduce strain on unpaid caregivers while helping people stay in their homes, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services will test an alternative payment for participants who deliver supportive services to people with dementia, including comprehensive, person-centered assessments and 24/7 access to a support line. Under the model, people with dementia and their caregivers will have access to a care navigator who will help them access services and support, including services such as meals and transportation through communitybased organizations. Across the United States, hundreds of religious communities lack financial resources sufficient to meet the retirement and healthcare needs of aging members.

Like many Americans, religious communities face the monumental challenge of funding eldercare. Currently, the average annual cost of care for women and men religious past age 70 is more than \$55,500 per person. Skilled care averages \$82,700. The total cost of care for senior women and men

religious in the United States has exceeded \$1 billion annually for each of the last 15 years.

More than 24,000 elderly sisters, brothers and religious order priests benefit from donations to the Retirement Fund for Religious, which underwrites financial assistance, consultation and education that help religious communities meet the immediate and ongoing needs of aging members.
