#### Dear HPA families,

Our 2nd-grade scholars have been studying Ancient Greece in their ELA blocks. In this unit, they learn about Mount Olympus, the Olympic Games, the democratic government of Athens, great Greek thinkers, and Alexander the Great among other topics. On Tuesday, Mrs. Bryant's classroom extended their learning by going to the Take Me There: Greece exhibit at The Children's Museum, researching more about Greek life and completing a scavenger hunt in the exhibit. Today, Mrs. Bryant's scholars participated in an Ancient Greece Dinner Party where they were able to taste and see foods from that era and civilization.





In the grammar stage of the Trivium, we intend to build scholars' knowledge of the world, introducing them to ideas and concepts that have withstood the test of time and that spark creativity and curiosity. Making what we read about in ELA more tangible—where our scholars can see artifacts and taste foods from the time period they are learning about—is just one example of how we are trying to advance timeless ideas at HPA.
