

# History of the Revere-Copley Rivalry "Battle for the Victory Bell"

#### Revere Vs. Copley Rivalry: History

#### HISTORY OF THE RIVALRY

Revere and Copley have one of the more storied rivalries in Northeast Ohio. These two neighboring school districts border one another and share the economic district known as Montrose. This rivalry carries a lot of great tradition and promotes a lot of fun between two of Ohio's finest high schools. Although heated in all sports, the Revere-Copley rivalry takes its most prominent form on the gridiron. Copley currently leads the series 34-32 and has a 12-5 advantage in the last 17 years. But Revere has a 24-17 advantage over Copley in the last 41 years. And these two teams have combined to win 40% of the Suburban League Titles (RHS-12; CHS-15) as well as a combined 20 state playoff appearances (RHS-8; CHS-12).

The rivalry actually began prior to the formation of Revere, back when the Bath Buccaneers played against the Copley Indians in the Old Summit County League. Just before the consolidation in 1950, the two teams did not play because of the enrollment difference—from the *Akron Beacon Journal*: "Copley and Bath were arch rivals for many years but their series lapsed when Copley's school enrollment considerably outgrew that of Bath. With the consolidation of Bath and Richfield, the boys at the Northwestern corner of the county are back at it again." As the October 1955 edition of the *Revere Lantern* referred to it, the meeting of these two teams on the football field is a "Classic Old Rival Gridiron Contest."

In 1968 a traveling trophy tradition was added to this backyard brawl when the student councils of Revere and Copley jointly purchased a bell for \$42.50. The bell was named the "Victory Bell" with the winning team claiming the rights to the bell for that year. Revere won the bell in the first year, beating Copley 33-20 on October 11, 1968. The bell used today is not the original bell or stand. In the early 1980's Copley students stole the bell from Revere and vandalized it, as a result—Copley was forced to purchase a replacement bell. The original stand was also replaced in 2001 after Copley painted and carved in the original when they held it in 1999 and 2000. In 2007, Revere students attempted to steal the bell from Copley High School but the attempt was thwarted—no damage was done to the bell.

The game took on a new tone in 1977 when <u>Joe Pappano</u> took over has the Head Coach at Revere. Pappano, a Copley resident, embraced this game and made sure his players understood the importance of this rivalry and worked especially hard during "Copley Week"—including turning on the stadium lights to practice after the sun had already set. Pappano also started the tradition of the "Beat Copley" T-shirts that were awarded to the football team if they defeated Copley.

Then this rivalry had the "Twelve Year War"! This marks a 12-year period (1990-2002) where Joe Pappano faced off against <u>Dan Boarman</u>. Both coaches were former players, coaches, and friends at St. Vincent-St. Mary. During this time, Revere held the advantage 9 wins to Copley's 4 wins.

#### What Makes Revere-Copley A Great Rivalry?

- It has to mean Something: For two communities that border each other and share Montrose—it means a lot. It is bragging rights for a year—knowing you can wear your Revere gear proudly in and around Montrose because Revere BEAT COPLEY! This game alone can make or break a season!
- **There has to be History**: Three years ago the two schools met for the 60<sup>th</sup> time and throughout that time there are so many stories that embrace this rivalry. From the ugly—vandalism, to fights, to taunting— to the good—great sportsmanship and philanthropic fundraisers/competitions between the two schools: there is enough history to last a lifetime.
- It has to be Competitive and Embrace Great Football: Copley currently leads the series by just one game—34 to 32. The two schools have great football tradition: two teams have combined to win 40% of the Suburban League Titles (RHS-12; CHS-15) as well as a combined 19 state playoff appearances (RHS-8; CHS-12).
- It Has to be Important to the Players: Only the current players can answer that—but there are hundreds of former players, to hundreds of former alumni students, and hundreds of current students form both schools that it means a lot to.

#### Revere-Copley "Countdown Clock"

This clock used to sit on the wall of the locker room and in the weight room and run year round to remind the football team of the next "Classic Old Rival Gridiron Contest" versus Copley for the "Victory Bell"



#### Revere—Copley "Victory Bell"

In 1968—the student councils of Revere and Copley jointly purchased a \$42.50 bell, which they named the "Victory Bell", with the winning team claiming the rights to the bell for that year.



The tradition was started in 1994 between Copley Athletic Director Larry Banner and Revere Alumnus Tim Godard ('70). It is to be placed in the football locker room or Athletic Office of the team that lost the Revere-Copley Football game (meaning eat "Crow").



#### "The NO BELL Prize"

The tradition was started between Jim Csikos from Jim's Locksmith on Copley Circle and Tim Godard (RHS Class of 1970) from Godard Auto Sales. Every year the ball is painted with the date and the score in the winner's colors, it is handed to the loser of the game, and then prominently displayed in the losers place of business for the next year.

#### "Copley Steak Dinner"

The annual Copley Steak Dinner was originally a "Senior Dinner" tradition that eventually transformed into a team dinner that takes place in the cafeteria following the Thursday practice prior to the Copley game. The fathers grill the steaks while the mothers prepare the sides (bake potato bar, sundae bar, etc.). After the dinner, many senior classes have either chosen to give themselves unique haircuts or shave their heads.

#### **Revere: BEAT COPLEY T-Shirts**

In 1977, Coach Joe Pappano started the tradition of the "Beat Copley" T-shirts. He had them made and handed them out to the players the Thursday before the game. The players wore them outwardly on their trip to Copley and proceeded to win that game (14-6). The following year the idea was changed to only giving out the shirts if the team won the football game. In 2003, the originally tradition was reinstated and the players now get the t-shirt before the game—the whole team wears them on the Thursday prior to the game.



#### 1950: September 22—Game 2—Revere (15) Vs. Copley (27)

• Copley defeated Revere 27 to 15. Losing by 9 to 14 in the fourth quarter, Revere's Ralph Senneff intercepted a pass and returned it 54-yards for the score. But Copley would respond as Ben Kimbrough scored on a 40-yard run and then Ken Bailey iced the game with another touchdown in the final seconds.

#### 1951: September 21—Game 2—Revere (0) Vs. Copley (69)

#### 1954: September 24—Game 2—Revere (7) @ Copley (21)

• Copley defeated Revere 21 to 7 as Nelson Eddy ran, passed, and kicked the Indians to the win. Copley's Nelson Eddy opened the scoring when he intercepted a pass and returned it 22 yards for the score and he kicked the extra point. In the third quarter, Eddy hit Dave Livergood on a 30-yard pass and kicked the extra point. Copley added its final score in the fourth quarter on a Ron Savioa 40-yard run and Eddy once again added the extra point. Revere scored its only touchdown in the fourth quarter when Gerald Hutchinson scored and Brian Shoemaker ran for the extra point.

#### 1955: September 23—Game 2—Copley (6) @ Revere (0)

• In rain and mud, Copley beat Revere 6 to 0. Revere drove deep into Copley territory on their first drive before a 15-yard penalty stalled the drive and the Minutemen turned it over on downs. On Copley's second play, Ron McFachons went the distance for the touchdown and the conversion failed—proved to be the only points in the game. Twice Revere drove deep into Copley territory but one drive ended with a fumble and the other turned over on downs at the 5-yard line. Copley had one more first down (14-13) but Revere had more total yards (128-98). For Revere, Ernie Prem was the top gainer. Both teams had 14 first downs

#### 1956: September 21—Game 2—Revere (7) @ Copley (13)

• Copley defeated Revere 13 to 7. The Indian's Ron McEachen ran 21 yards for the first score (the conversion was good). Revere then tied the game with a 50-yard run by Dick Kerekes and a Doug Johnson pass to Bing Short was good for the conversion. From that point the contest was back and forth until Duane Smith's fake punt came up short for the Minutemen and gave Copley a short field. Emich ended up scoring the game winning touchdown for the Indians.

#### 1957: September 20—Game 2—Copley (0) @ Revere (6)

- Revere slipped by Copley 6 to 0 to gain their first victory over the Indians in their 6<sup>th</sup> attempt. Earl Holderfield had a 45-yard touchdown run in the first quarter and then the Minutemen defense dominated the rest of the game. Copley's biggest scoring threat came at the end of the game when they reached Revere's 17 but a Ronnie Longfellow interception ended the Indian's scoring threat.

#### 1958: September 19—Game 2—Revere (22) @ Copley (0)

• Revere defeated Copley 22 to 0. The Minutemen scored first on a Bruce Saxman 2-yard run in the first quarter. The teams then engaged in a defensive battle where both teams had touchdowns negated due to penalties. Revere scored its second touchdown early in the fourth quarter when Saxman scored again and Bing Short had the successful conversion. The final score was by Earl Holderfield with Rich Scuba adding the conversion.

#### 1959: September 25—Game 2—Copley (6) @ Revere (28)

• Revere beat Copley 28 to 6. Copley's Mike Badalich opened the scoring, the Indian's only score, with a 4-yard run—the extra point failed. Revere then took the lead on a Dave Jones 1-yard run with Earl Holderfield adding the 2-point try. Revere never looked back from there and scored 20 more unanswered points.

#### 1960: October 21—Game 6—Copley (24) @ Revere (14)

• Copley beat Revere 24 to 14 in this rivalry game. With the game tied at 14-14, Copley's Gary Morrison had a 45-yard touchdown run in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter and then Roger Terry added another touchdown on their next drive. Mike Foster caught two touchdown passes from Terry (both 30-yarders) for Copley's first touchdowns. Revere's two scores were by Phil Wisnieski—he would later leave the game with an injured shoulder. Note: The *Akron Beacon Journal* noted that this game is where "both teams were 'up' for this game, accurately billed as a strong rivalry in which past performances are not a factor."

#### 1961: October 20—Game 6—Revere (6) @ Copley (28)

• Copley beat Revere 28 to 6 as Gary Morrison scored four rushing touchdowns (80, 13, 8, and 2-yard runs). Barton caught two conversion attempts for the Indians. Revere's only score was a 1-yard run by Chuck Taylor.

#### 1962: October 19—Game 6—Copley (15) @ Revere (14)

• Copley scored 15 points off two key Revere fumbles to defeat the Minutemen 15 to 14. Revere scored first off a 60-yard drive with John Bergvall scoring from 7-yards out but the Minutemen would miss the extra point—which proved to be the difference in the game. Copley scored next on a 2-yard run by Larry Savoia—the score was set up by a Revere fumble of a punt at their own 5-yard line. Copley was led by Lloyd Garden (120 yards on 22 carries), Faheem Dix (5 of 10 for 44 yards), and Eric Betz (2 receptions for 31 yards).

• Visiting Revere defeated Copley 6 to 0 in extremely sloppy conditions to retain the Victory Bell—Minutemen have beaten Copley 16 of the past 19 meetings.. Both teams missed two field goal attempts and the Minutemen missed their PAT conversion. The only touchdown came on a 6-minute, 86 yard drive that ended with a Ryan Huffman 2-yard run however it was a 30-yard tailback pass that got the ball to the goal line. Not only was the score close but so were the game statistics: Revere had 13 first downs while Copley had 12, Revere had 149 yards rushing while Copley had 139, and Revere had 87 yards passing while Copley had 67. Copley's Lloyd Garden rushed for 108 yards on 22 carries while Revere's Ryan Huffman rushed for 82 yards on 18 carries.

Leading the way for the Indians was Alan Sipple (193 passing yards) and Marcus Gould (75 yards rushing on 17 carries) while Jared Ellerson and Jason Rininger each had 8 receptions. The second was with 1:50 to play as the Minutemen were driving; Copley intercepted a pass and returned it to their 1-yard line to set up the Indian's final score. Copley's Delone Carter rushed for 140 yards on 21 carries while Revere's Evan Laube rushed for 132 yards.

The Minutemen defense would tighten though and forced a fourth-and-3 from the 6 but Revere jumped offside and Carter leaped over for the score with just 57 seconds left in the half. Copley was led by Delone Carter, David Arnold (74 yard pass reception and 77 yard interception return), and Jason Borchik (7 of 13 for 129 yards). Revere was led by Corey Kurtz (despite three interceptions, he passed for 158 yards including a touchdown pass) and Tom Romito (88 yards rushing with a touchdown, 43 yard touchdown pass, and an interception).

Copley was led by Kwame Harvey who had a 45-yard touchdown run and a 25 yard pass reception from Dom McClain Revere's offense was led by Abraham Addison (139 yards rushing and two touchdowns on 20 carries) but the Minutemen had an ineffective passing game (2 of 17 with two interceptions) that hurt them in 3<sup>rd</sup> down situations.

#### 2008: September 26—Game 6—Copley (14) @ Revere (17)

Senior quarterback Zach Weidrick hit Stephen Zarkovacki on a 17-yard touchdown pass early in the fourth that proved to be the winning score. Copley scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter, but missed a 50-yard field goal attempt in the final seconds that would have tied the game. Revere was led by Weidrick (completed 7 of 9 passes for 90 yards and two touchdowns) John Battaglia (148 yards rushing on 40 carries), and Stephen Zarkovacki (49 yards on four receptions). The Revere defense limited Copley to 10 yards rushing behind the efforts of Dave Flegal (8 tackles) and Chris Gibbs (7 tackles). For Copley, Dom McClain rushed for a touchdown and was 16 of 26 for 218 yards with a touchdown pass.

It was a close games as both teams sustained drives before they faltered but Copley got on the board first off a 93 yard drive that resulted in a 46 yard touchdown pass from Lou Gigliotti to Terrell Hill. Revere put together a drive at the end of the second half that had the Minutemen at the Copley 16 with 33 seconds, but an interception ended the drive and Copley took a 7-0 lead into halftime. The second Revere's run game dominated. Revere started the second half, driving the ball 80 yards that resulted in senior John Battaglia's 9 yard run. The Revere defense then held Copley to a 3-and-out and got the ball back at their own 46 yard line. They took the ball and drove down to the Copley five yard line where on 4<sup>th</sup> and 1, Battaglia scored on the 5 yard run to put Revere up 14 -7. With Copley leading 21-20 Copley in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter, the fireworks went off as three touchdowns in a span of less than two minutes: Zach Lalkowski caught an 11-yard touchdown pass for the Minutemen, then Aulden Knight raced 80 yards for a touchdown to give the Indians the 27-26 lead but Revere then responded as Chase Costanzo threw a 67-yard touchdown pass to junior Nick Zimmerman with eight minutes to play to give the Minutemen the lead 32 to 27 and the win. Leading the way for the Minutemen offensively were Chase Costanzo (24 of 35 for 396 yards and four touchdowns to go with a rushing touchdown) and Zach Lalkowski (13 receptions for 221 yards and two touchdowns). Leading the way for the Indians offensively was Aulden Knight (252 yards and three touchdowns on 22 carries), John Kromalic (165 yards passing), and Milton Greer (3 receptions for 123 yards and a touchdown). Defensively, Oliver Johnson had 24 tackles (15 solo) for the Indians.

Copley fought back with a Hayden Neal 7 yard run before the half. The Indians' Colton Lenke kicked a 31-yard field goal for the game's only third quarter scoring. Revere then extended their lead with a 64-yard touchdown run in the third quarter by Nate Predojev to give Revere a 21-10 lead. Copley answered right back with a 17-yard touchdown run by Weston Bridges and then took the lead in the fourth quarter off a 56-yard punt return by Aulden Knight. The Minutemen drove down to the Indians 8-yard line but turned it over on downs as time expired. Leading the way for the Minutemen offensively was Clayton Langdon (99 yards on 16 attempts), Nick Zimmerman (94 yards on 10 attempts), and Zach Lalkowski (3 receptions for 53 yards). Copley was led by Aulden Knight (151 yards rushing on 26 carries) and Weston Bridges (113 yards on 14 carries and a touchdown).

The Copley Indians jumped out to a 40 to 0 halftime lead and cruised to the victory. Copley was led by Austin Brenner who was 13 of 14 for 400 yards and six touchdowns (all series records, his 400 yards passing is 4<sup>th</sup> in league history, and his 6 touchdowns ties a league record). He connected twice with Daniel Ester and Chan Park for scores and also found Larnell Nealy and Madison Prokop for touchdowns—(the 75 yarder to Prokop sets longest Copley touchdown pass in the series history). Weston Bridges rushed for 50 yards and a touchdown on 11 carries. Leading the way for the Minutemen offensively was Clayton Langdon who rushed for 118 yards on 21 attempts.

Revere was led by AJ Hughes (131 yards rushing and a touchdown on 27 carries to go with 9 of 25 for 115 yards and a touchdown), Clayton Langdon (89 yards rushing and a touchdown on 20 carries as well as a 22 yard touchdown reception), and Matt Giltner (2 FGs [42 and 32] and 3 PATs).

The score was then tied 17-17 when Buser scored with three seconds on the clock to give Revere a 24-17 halftime lead. Copley then turned the game around in the third quarter, taking a 38-31 before adding two fourth quarter touchdowns to seal the win. Copley was led by Blake Traylor (222 yards rushing and four touchdowns on 22 carries) and Jacob Nedolast (8 of 13 for 111 yards and a touchdown to go with 93 yards rushing on 12 carries). Revere was led by Matt Buser (three touchdowns, 105 yards rushing on 23 carries, five receptions for 135 yards, and a 92-yard kickoff return), Nate Klonowski (23 of 45 for 340 yards and two touchdowns), and Bryce Holt (10 receptions for 99 yards).

# History of the Revere-Copley Rivalry "Battle for the Gold Ball"



#### Revere Vs. Copley Basketball Rivalry

The rivalry between Revere and Copley may have started on the gridiron but it quickly spilled over to the basketball court. Copley currently leads the all-time series 93 to 50 in regular season contests (there have been a number of post season contests between the two schools). Even though the series may look lopsided, the games have been extremely competitive: Copley holds slight overall point advantage (7,374-7,186) and the average margin is in Copley's favor by only 1 point.

#### **Gold Ball Trophy**

The Golden Ball Trophy, a traveling trophy tradition, was begun in 2003 by the two school's basketball coaches (RHS—Dean Rahas and Copley—Dana Addis) with the winner of the second regular season game claiming the rights to the trophy for that year. In 2013, the trophy was renamed and dedicated in honor of Coach Al Smesko (Revere) and Coach Bruce Falb (Copley). The Gold Ball Series is lead by Copley 10 to 5.





#### COACH AL SMESKO

Al Smesko coached boys' basketball at Revere High School from 1959 until 1993. His teams won 171 games, including one sectional championship and two Suburban League

During his coaching career, Revere played Copley High School 28 times in which they split the games played at 14

Prior to becoming the varsity coach, Al coached basketball 16 years for 7th grade through JV. He was also assistant track coach for 2 years and assistant football coach for 6 years. Al has been a track official for 30 years.

Al was president of the Greater Akron Basketball Coaches Association in 1982 and was inducted into the Greater Akron Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame in 1992. He was inducted into the Revere High School Hall of Fame in 1994.

Al currently is a mainstay at many of our sporting events. He operates the scoreboards for football, boys and girls soccer, boys and girls basketball and boys and girls lacrosse.



#### COACH BRUCE FALB

Bruce Falb graduated from Copley High School in 1945, earning 3 varsity letters in both football and basketball. After serving in the Navy, and then earning 2 football letters while attending BGSU, he graduated and returned to his Alma Mater as a teacher and coach. He served as the head boys' basketball coach at Copley High School for 31 years from 1956 to 1987.

His teams won 371 games, including 3 undefeated, regular seasons, and 12 Suburban League Championships. highlighted by 6 in a row (1978-79 through 1983-84).

He concluded his 39 years of service at Copley High School serving as the Athletic Director until his retirement in 1991. He was elected into the Greater Akron Basketball Hall of Fame in 1981, and the Copley High School Hall of Fame in 2008, the inaugural CHS Hall of Fame Class.

Bruce passed away in August of 2003.



#### It's Copley vs. Revere, but also Falb vs. Smesko

If it were a game of chess, Bruce Falb probably would be sitting on the edge of his chair. He'd fidget a bit, stand up, sit down, tug at his sweater or hitch up his pants. Al Smesko, the opponent, would sit with perfect posture. His tie would be loose but not sloppy. He'd be perceptive, calculating, studious. Falb's pieces would weave over the squares, a general plan in mind: Stay loose and adapt. Smesko's pieces would move with deliberate accuracy, a specific plan in mind: Take what the opponent gives, adjust accordingly, be precise.

# History of the Revere-Copley Food Drive

#### **Revere-Copley Food Drive Competition**

#### THE FOOD DRIVE COMPETITION:

Linda Boggs, a longtime teacher and head of Copley's student council came up with the idea in 1989 to "put the sports rivalry between the two schools to good use." The competition was for the collection of canned and nonperishable goods. The competition went on for five years and included a plaque that the winning school displayed.

The contest was rived in 2016-17 by leaders from both schools (Revere—Phil King, Jennifer Kirchner, and Rebecca Ray) (Copley—Michael Curry and Kim Carothers).

#### THE RIVALRY:

Revere and Copley have one of the more storied rivalries in Northeast Ohio. These two neighboring school districts border one another and share the economic district known as Montrose. This rivalry carries a lot of great tradition and promotes a lot of fun between two of Ohio's finest high schools. The rivalry actually began prior to the formation of Revere, back when the Bath Buccaneers played against the Copley Indians in the Old Summit County League.

**Football**—In 1968 a traveling trophy tradition was added to this backyard brawl when the student councils of Revere and Copley jointly purchased a bell for \$42.50. The bell was named the "Victory Bell" with the winning team claiming the rights to the bell for that year. The Victory Bell Series is led by Revere 27 to 22 (Copley leads 33 to 32 overall).

**Basketball**—The rivalry between Revere and Copley may have started on the gridiron but it quickly spilled over to the basketball court. In 2003 the Golden Ball Trophy, a traveling trophy tradition, was started by the two schools' basketball coaches (RHS—Dean Rahas and Copley—Dana Addis) with the winner of the second regular season game claiming the rights to the trophy for that year. In 2013, the trophy was renamed and dedicated in honor of Coach Al Smesko (Revere) and Coach Bruce Falb (Copley). The Gold Ball Series is led by Copley 5 to 9 (Copley leads 92 to 50 overall).

#### **Revere-Copley Food Drive Competition**

#### 1988-89: REVERE

• Revere beat Copley 5,000 cans to 1,000 cans. Adding in the money collected, Revere won 11,000 to 5,000. The money was donated directly to *Good Neighbors* while the food was disbursed locally.

#### 1989-90: REVERE

• Revere beat Copley 12,200 cans to 12,000 cans.

#### 1990-91: COPLEY

• Copley beat Revere 15,000 cans to 8,000 cans. The total includes actual cans or donations of \$0.75 which equaled one can. Donations gathered by Copley were given to the Copley Kiwanis for distribution in the Copley-Fairlawn area. Donations gathered by Revere were distributed in the Bath-Richfield area.

#### 1991-92: COPLEY

• Copley beat Revere 16,849 cans to 1,595 cans.

#### 1992-93: COPLEY

• Copley beat Revere 13,000 cans to 5,000 cans.

#### 2016-17: REVERE

• Revere defeated Copley 11,960 to 9,586. The collections were donated to the Akron-Canton Foodbank. The contest was based on total meals (1.2 lbs equaling one meal and \$1 equaling 4 meals [for can count, \$1 equals 4 cans]).

#### Student Council holds food drive competition

Revere's Student Council revived an old tradition by challenging rival Copley to a canned food drive competition, which Revere won.

According to a report by Phil Heyn titled "History of the Revere-Copley Food Drive," the two schools hosted the competition for five consecutive years from 1988 until 1993. Although Revere and Copley have individually held food drives annually, this year's competition, called the We Can School Challenge, marked the first time Revere and Copley have competed against each other since the event's twenty-four year hiatus. The competition took place from January 17 until January 31, and Revere High School and Copley High School competed to bring in the most canned food items. Both schools donated the food items to the Akron-Canton Regional Food Bank.

Copley High School Principal Michael Coury commented on the rivalry between Revere and Copley.

"I think it's an awesome opportunity to engage students across our two excellent districts. I love that our two schools have a fun and healthy rivalry, yet at the same time, many of our students are friends. Having a competition such as this keeps that rivalry alive and, more importantly, benefits those in need in our area," Coury said.

Revere High School Principal Phil King noted the importance of food drives.

"First, you are helping those that are in need. That's the most important part, and I think everyone at this school has an opportunity to bring in something—to be helpful to people in our community," King said.

Revere's Student Council, including

staff leaders Jennifer Kirchner and Rebecca Ray, initiated the idea and organization of the canned food drive competition. Student Council co-presidents Simona Jasova and Courtney McClellan, vice president Ellie Edwards and other Student Council members ran the event. McClellan described the incentive that the competition provides for students.

"I believe it's a great way to keep kids motivated. Giving kids something to look forward to at the end of any task will help generate more participation and a great outcome," McClellan said.

Junior and Student Council vice president Ellie Edwards compared this year's food drive competition with the food drives of previous years.

"I think it's a really good idea because people donate more when there's a competition, especially with our rival. We've also never publicized this well, which is also great. And it's only usually been one week instead of two. So, overall we're just getting more food, and that's the goal," Edwards said.

Edwards also described how the food drive makes donating simple and convenient.

"We are a really wealthy district, and we have a lot to offer, but people don't really think about it or have time to run down to the food bank. So, if you can do it through the school, I think that's a really beneficial thing to people less fortunate than we at Revere," Edwards said.

Both Revere and Copley made and exchanged video announcements about the canned food drive to publicize the competition. RHS Principal Phil King noted the effectiveness of the video announcements.

"You just get kids more involved, more excited, and if it challenges each other, I think that's a good thing," King said.

The canned food drive competition ended January 31st, the day of the Copley-Revere basketball game. McClellan described the benefits of the competition ending on this day.

"The winner [was] announced at the basketball game, so in return, we [got] people to come to the game and to come to hear the results of the competition. I think since the competition is between Revere and Copley, having it end on the day of the game is a great idea," McClellan said.

McClellan also explained the lesserknown impact that food donations have on local families.

"The food drives help many people within our immediate area that are in severe need for food. Not many people realize that, but a lot of families that live close to us benefit from the Akron Canton Regional Food Bank," McClellan said.

Revere collected enough cans and money for a total of 11,960 meals, exceeding its goal of 5,000 cans and defeating Copley. Copley collected enough cans and money for 9,586 meals. Nicholas Kos's class collected enough cans and money for 118.8 meals per student, the most for Revere. Revere and Copley hope to continue the canned food drive competition in the future.

## Defeated by cans

• Copley beats Revere, 13,000 to 5,000, in holiday food drive to help needy families, setting tie for four years

Copley High School pounded Revere High School by a score of 13,000 to 5,000 to even the record at 2-2.

But the real winners are the families who will receive the 18,000 canned and nonperishable goods collected by the two student bodies.

Copley teacher and student council adviser Linda Boggs said the holiday competition was started four years ago because the school's canned food drive was lagging.

There's no better way to get Copley blood boiling than to mention Revere, the school's arch rival, Boggs said. "It's been that way since time began," she explained.

So the stakes were upped and school pride was put on the line.

Last year, Revere crushed Copley 16,849 cans to 1,595.

Copley junior Jennifer Cleveland, 16, who helped organize this year's canned food drive, said there is another incentive for students in her school to participate.

The competition extends between grades, with the winner earning spirit points toward becoming the class of the year.

This year, the seniors delivered 10 carloads with about 4,000 cans for a come-from-behind victory.

"The seniors always hit us at the end and they always end up winning," Jennifer said.

## Copley tops Revere in can drive, but needy families are winners

A rivalry between two area high schools has turned out to be beneficial for needy families.

The third annual canned food drive between Copley and Revere high schools brought in the equivalent of 23,000 cans in a two-week contest that wrapped up before Christmas.

Copley won this year's contest, bringing in 15,000 cans, and Revere had about 8,000. The total includes actual cans or donations of 75 cents, which equaled one can.

Officials announced this week that the donations gathered by Copley were given to the Copley Kiwanis for distribution in the Copley-Fairlawn area. This year, 53 families received food baskets, with 49 also receiving \$40 gift certificates for groceries at the Copley Country Market. Turkeys also were given to 38 of the families

The cans collected by Revere are distributed in Bath Township.

The contest, sponsored by the student councils at the schools, is the result of an idea by Linda Boggs, who teaches legal medicine and computers at Copley. A 20-year veteran teacher, Boggs decided to put the sports rivalry between the two schools to good use.

"I just thought it'd be nice to help people out, especially since some have so much and others have nothing," she said. Boggs, who is the student council's faculty adviser, said she encouraged the students to participate in the drive, but it was the students who really made a difference. Several members of the student council urged other schools in the system to contribute, and some even went door to door seeking donations, she said.

The first contest, held in 1988, ended with Revere winning, 5,000 cans to 1,000. Last year, the con-

test was closer, with Revere winning by about 200, with a 12,200 total. Now the plaque, which is displayed by the school that wins, will rest in Copley High's main hall.

Boggs, who also has her legal medicine class adopt a Copley-Fairlawn family each year, shrugs off the success of the contest, saying she only wanted to "do something to get the kids inspired."
