MICRO-INTERNSHIPS POSSIBLE THROUGH PARTNERSHIP WITH UNIVERSITY OF AKRON

We are excited about a new internship opportunity for several of our most accomplished Revere High School seniors and have invited local businesses to partner with us. The purpose of this program is to help high school seniors gain a better understanding of what various careers in business truly look like. This insight will help to better inform their college major exploration process and to gain collegiate-level professional development and leadership skills.

The Career-Exploration Micro-Internship Program for High School Seniors is a unique work-based learning program where high school seniors from Revere High School will participate in paid professional activities (micro-internships). The program will provide authentic professional learning experiences to link and develop their academic, technical, and professional skills while helping them explore future career possibilities.

This program provides a unique Community-Business-University Collaboration whereby area businesses commit to paid micro-internships, Revere High School commits a cohort of 15 eager high school, college-bound seniors, and The University of Akron College of Business commits their unique and advanced professional and leadership development resources as well as program administration.



NEW RHS BAND UNIFORMS WILL DEBUT FALL 2023

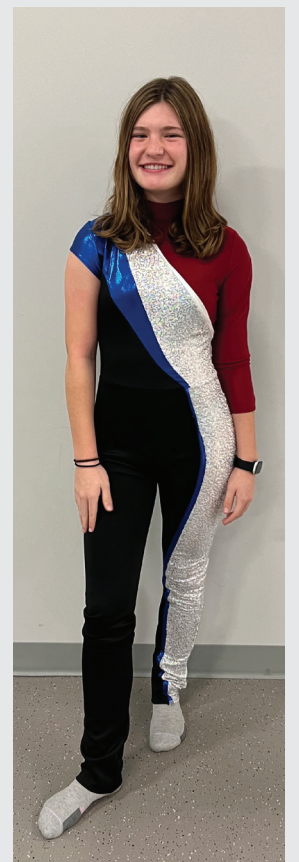
When Revere Music Parent Association (RMPA) purchased marching band uniforms eight years ago for the 2015 season, they committed to set aside funds from future fundraisers each year to eventually purchase replacements. Acquiring new uniforms is necessary at this time due to the seven to eight year lifespan of the garments.

In early September 2022, RMPA approached Treasurer Mr. Richard Berdine for support and funding to purchase new band uniforms. As Revere Local Schools have done before, they matched the group's contribution, which resulted in a successful purchase of new marching band and color guard ensembles. We subsequently collaborated with the uniform company to produce design options!

To create a modern look for our band uniforms, we enlisted the help of Stanbury Uniforms out of Missouri, who had outfitted us twice in the past. They were provided with our preferred colors and earlier designs as references, intending to combine previous elements while also adding in current trends. After receiving three draft designs from their artist, it was up to the directors to decide which one best reflected our style. After careful review, the group made a choice they felt suited the students best.

After the design was chosen, Stansbury sent us a prototype for evaluation. This was the time to suggest any alterations for the final version. Moreover, these band uniform sketches were sent to the respective color guard company, Creative Costuming out of Huntington Beach, California, to create an accompanying uniform for the color guard squad.

The Revere Music Parent Association and the Revere Local School District are delighted to introduce their new band and color guard uniform designs, which will be worn proudly for the next eight years. Thank you to all involved in this process!

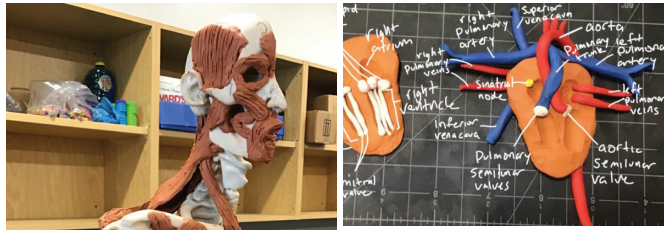
CLAY BRINGS ANATOMY CLASS TO LIFE

Revere High School teacher Mrs. Olivia Pettigrew has the honor of teaching upper-level students Anatomy. Beginning in the 2019-2020 school year, she recommended Revere begin to use the innovative Zahourek Systems Inc.'s trademarked Anatomy in Clay Learning System.

To kick off each school year, the students have an "Adoption Day" where they form groups and name the manikin they will use for the entire academic year. They continuously utilize these manikins throughout the year—augmenting them with more clay and new body systems as the year progresses.

"The Anatomy in Clay System is a great way to make complex anatomy content more manageable and enjoyable for the students. It is used not only for studying the muscular system but also to explore different body regions, identify bones, analyze body planes, and study the integumentary, cardiovascular, respiratory, and digestive systems!" said Mrs Pettigrew.

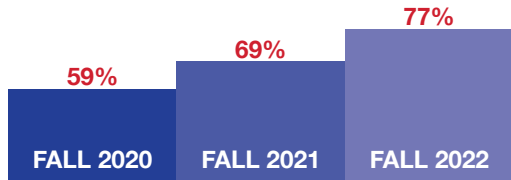
The material is embedded deeply in their memories by providing auditory, kinesthetic, and visual stimuli to students while they learn. Auditory learners hear about body systems; kinesthetic learners build them with clay models; visual learners observe detailed manikins. This allows all learning styles to be engaged with the subject matter for better retention.



GRADE 3 READING RESULTS

Each year, third graders take the Ohio State Test for English language arts in the fall and spring. Our Fall 2022 grade 3 reading achievement results were recently released. The data represents the number of students who reached proficiency or above on this assessment.
