#### Message from the Mayor



Hello Medford!

We've had a very busy October with tons of events, groundbreakings, vaccine clinics, construction, and more! There are so many exciting improvements happening around our City like the Carr Park renovation groundbreaking, which we held earlier this month and as we look ahead to November, the Clippership Connector Greenway Project is finally getting underway! We've also celebrated our Cltizen of the Year, Joan Gatto, with a key to the city, our disABILITY Fair, Hispanic Heritage Month, along with many other wonderful events.

Here are just a few of our October highlights, but keep reading to see more:

- The City broke ground on our nearly \$3 million renovation project at Carr Park this
  month. Phase I has officially begun construction and will include an accessible path,
  reconstruction of two baseball diamonds, fully dedicated pickleball courts, and more
  when finished!
- I toured the construction site of the Great American Beer Hall, a 19,000 square foot beer garden and entertainment space that will open this June on Mystic Avenue!
- We held two senior flu vaccine clinics this month and have one more scheduled for early November for anyone ages 3 and up! Register <u>here</u> and keep an eye out for information on COVID booster clinics as vaccines become available.
- We are expanding bicycle infrastructure with four new Bluebike stations and additional bicycle parking in locations around the city with an over \$185,000 in grant funding that we secured from two Community Connections Grants. These stations will build upon the eight current ones, two scheduled for installation by the City this fall, and two more scheduled from Tufts this fall.

Got a chance to tour the construction site of the Great American Beer Hall opening on Mystic Avenue this upcoming June! The foundation is getting poured next week!

This property, previously an automotive repair facility, will soon house a 19,000 square foot food and beverage space with 90 different beers on tap, burger and pizza vendors, as well as communal spaces to enjoy sports and entertainment on the big screen.

There will be an outdoor pickle ball court and I'm hoping a spot to play indoors as well. Thank you to Brian Zarthar, a co-owner of the beer hall, and the team at Haynes Group for giving me a tour and talking about the progress of the project.

## Clippership Connector Groundbreaking







After years of advocacy, planning and countless community meetings with the Department of Conservation and Recreation, we are finally breaking ground on the Clippership Connector Path!

This transformational greenway will connect Riverbend Park to Clippership Park and create a safer, accessible pedestrian and bike pathway stretching from Belmont to Assembly Square and beyond for people of all ages and abilities.

This day would not have been possible without the tireless work of so many community advocates and organizations like the Mystic River Watershed Association, Medford Bicycle Advisory Commission, Preserve Medford and WalkMedford, our state partners at DCR, as well our state delegation, specifically Rep. Barber who along with Rep. Donato and Rep. Garballey helped secure funding for the project.

It has also been a project long in development with our Planning, Development and Sustainability team led by Alicia Hunt, the Community Preservation Committee and Roberta Cameron, and stretches back to a state grant secured by Mayor Stephanie Burke.

I can't wait to see this path finally open for the public and provide a safer, greener experience to better explore our city and our region!

Have you seen City Hall's new pollinator garden? We planted this garden out front to support essential pollinators like butterflies and bees.

Thank you to the Tufts Pollinator Initiative for recommending plants and helping us plan, our DPW for helping with the installation, and Kim DeAndrade from the Mystic Charles Pollinator Pathways Group and Amanda Bowen from the Medford Community Garden for helping us layout and install all 85 plants.

## **Carr Park Renovation Groundbreaking**





We officially broke ground on the first phase of a nearly \$3 million renovation project at Carr Park!

This massive reimagining of the park will see a new accessible path that circles the entire field, reconstruction of two baseball diamonds, a woodland area cleanup and invasive plant removal, fully dedicated pickle ball courts and more!

From the beginning, this has been a community driven process that will shape the future of Carr Park by implementing key priorities that residents identified during multiple public meetings and info sessions. Special thanks to Chenin Peloquin who has been a major advocate for park improvements focused on accessibility.

The second phase of this project is funded through a federal earmark secured by Congresswoman Katherine Clark and will boast a four season playground, obstacle course and fitness area, teen swings, two basketball courts, a water play feature and more!


While all these changes are definitely an improvement to the space, I still heard from one nostalgic youth park goer who said they will miss the park they grew up using. To help make this change a little easier, we encouraged everyone to grab a bit of Medford history and collect dirt from the park before the project gets underway. Glad to see the memory of the original park will endure on bookshelves and mantles throughout the City!

All of this work would not have been possible without the incredible work of our team in the office of Planning, Development and Sustainability led by Director Alicia Hunt with the help of planner Amanda Centrella, the team at DPW, the Recreation Department, office of Procurement, as well as support from Roberta Cameron and the Community Preservation Committee.

City, State and Local Partners to Break Ground on Clippership Connector Path Project



The City of Medford and the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) will hold a groundbreaking ceremony on the Clippership Connector Pedestrian Path Project on Thursday, November 2 at 12 p.m. at Riverbend Park, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced.

The Clippership Connector will be a path located along Mystic River, between Clippership Drive and Riverbend Park. This half-mile waterfront path will connect more than 10 miles of contiguous greenways and aims to

Medford Devotes Over \$350,000 to Removing Stumps and Planting Trees Throughout City This Year



The City is in the process of removing stumps and planting new trees to improve accessibility to sidewalks as well as advance the administration's climate goals, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. To date, crews have removed 360 stumps since the beginning of this year and have planted 40 trees enroute to achieving the City's goal of planting 200 trees in 2023. Fall is the ideal planting season for trees where the climate and soil produce the optimal environment for healthy growth.

provide a safer route between Medford Square, Andrews and McGlynn Schools, and Riverbend Park. This project is a partnership between the DCR, the City of Medford, the Mystic River Watershed Association, and WalkMedford through the DCR Partnership Grant Program.

In December 2022, the City identified over 500 stumps for removal across all neighborhoods and has leveraged over \$350,000 through various funding sources including CDBG, ARPA and bonding to help complete the work. To date, 360 stumps have been removed.

## Fall "Big Sweep" to Begin on November 20

The Medford DPW will conduct fall street sweeping over the course of several weeks, beginning on Monday, November 20 with Zone 6. In the interest of public health and public safety, the DPW will proceed with the fall Big Sweep over several weeks to clear leaves and debris from streets and catch basins, allowing for proper drainage of water and making sure that our City's streets are clean and safe. The DPW conducts two Big Sweep events on all secondary roads twice each year, once in the spring and once in the fall.

Street sweeping will be conducted Monday through Friday, between the hours of 8am and 6pm. Street sweeping is divided into 14 zones with one zone conducted each day. The full schedule and a list of all zones can be found at www.medfordma.org/street-sweeping. In the event of heavy rain or severe weather, sweeping may be cancelled on that day, and would be rescheduled for the end of the regular schedule. # City Secures over \$170K in Funding to Help Strengthen its Storm Resiliency in South Medford

The City of Medford will invest over \$170,000 in state grant funding to help strengthen and enhance its storm resiliency infrastructure, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced.

The grant from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Housing and Livable Communities (EOHLC) Housing Choice Grant Program will be used for flood mitigation efforts in South Medford.

"Due to our proximity to the Mystic River and other substantial waterways, many of our neighborhoods, like South Medford, are at risk of flooding and other storm related damage," Mayor Lungo-Koehn said. "We've made a concerted effort to strengthen our infrastructure and protect our community from the effects of climate change over the past three and half years, and with this grant we'll be able to make critical upgrades to our sewers and flood mitigation management."

# City to Install Four New Bluebike Stations

The City is expanding bicycle infrastructure with four new Bluebike stations and additional bicycle parking areas, announced Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn. The City secured over \$185,000 in grant funding from two Community Connections Grants from the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) and Metropolitan Area Planning Council (MAPC) that will be used to fund the projects.

As the largest clothing collector in the Northeast, Helpsy partners with municipalities and organizations across 11 states to collect unwanted clothing

and other textiles in order to keep clothes out of landfills. In 2021, the company diverted nearly 30 million pounds of textiles from landfills through a combination of clothing drives, home pickups, thrift store partners and clothing receptacles.

As part of its environmental mission, Helpsy now requires a three bag minimum for pickups. The company is optimizing routes in order to use resources as wisely as possible and reduce environmental impact.

Can't stay but want your pumpkins composted? Drop them off! Please remove paint, candles, and decorations.


## **Charter Study Committee Listening Sessions**




- Wednesday, November 8, 7 p.m. at the Medford Public Library, Room 5, 111 High St., Medford.
