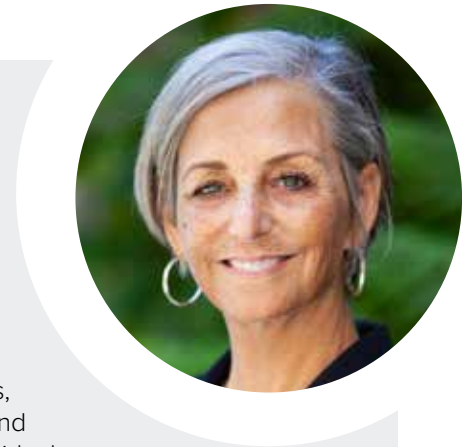

## OUR HISTORY

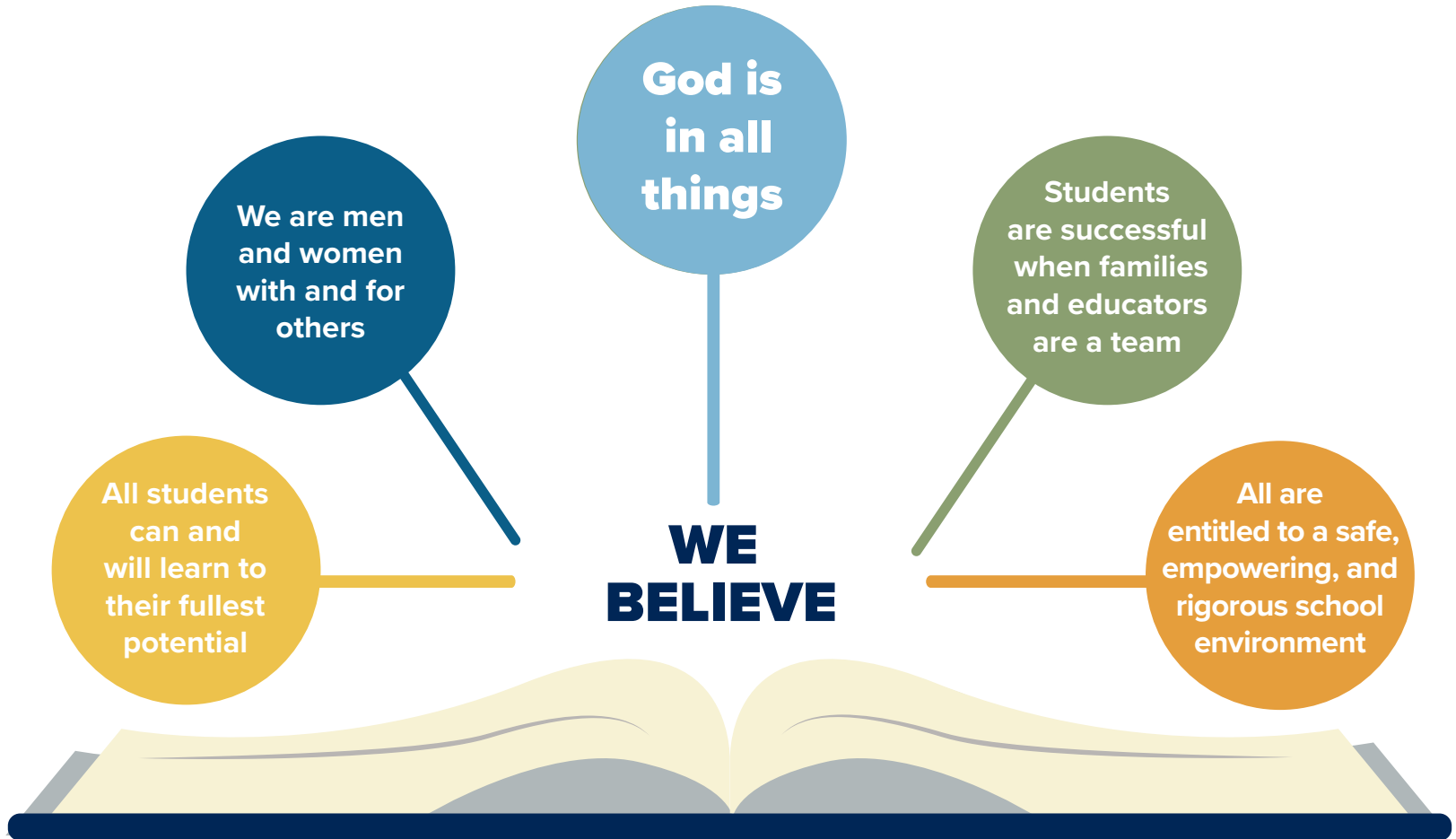
On Oct. 8, 2016, St. Ignatius College Preparatory President Edward A. Reese, S.J., announced the creation of the Fr. Sauer Academy, named for Anthony P. Sauer, S.J., the longtime president of St. Ignatius. FSA began as a full scholarship middle school program in August 2017 with its first class of sixth graders.

In June 2020, the middle school graduated and promoted its first class of students.

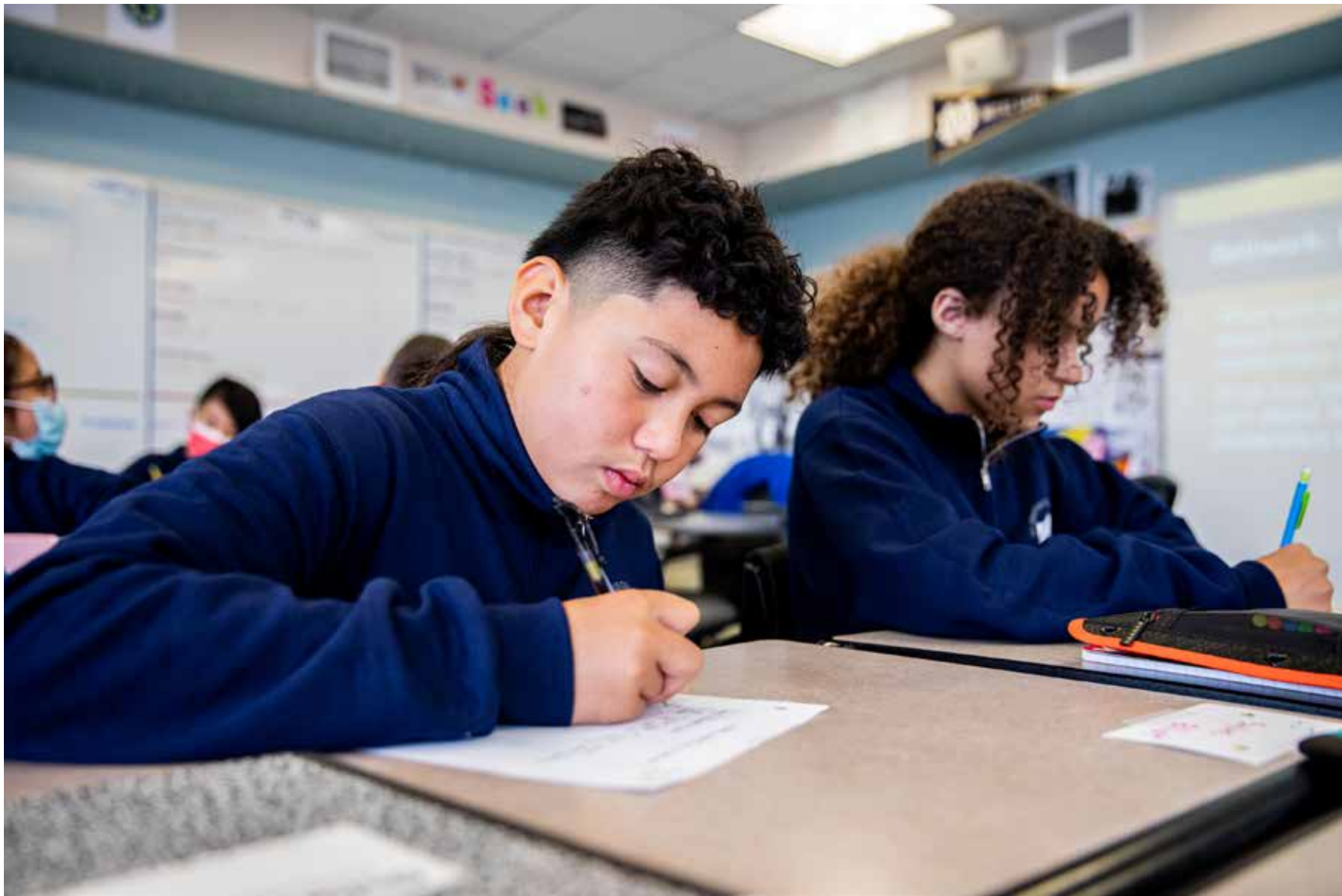

# HELPING STUDENTS JUMP TO THE NEXT LEVEL

## PROGRAMS

### Curriculum

Math, Reading, Language, Religion, Wellness, PE, Social Studies, Journalism  
• 11 month program

The goal for all Fr. Sauer Academy students is to be successful in high school, college, and beyond. Students at the Fr. Sauer Academy receive daily instruction in four core classes: Computer Science, English Language Arts, Math, and Social Studies. They also start the day with a Religion component with their homeroom teacher. Students at FSA have a number of other weekly classes including Journalism, P.E., Wellness, and electives.

FSA also offers a Daily Academic Support Hub (DASH) twice a day to assist students outside of their direct classroom instruction. The first component is our mandatory lunch DASH for students with late or missing work, which is designed to prevent students from falling behind and to provide extra time to focus on organizational skills. Faculty and high school students, most of whom are FSA alums, also provide after-school DASH from Monday through Thursday. This is an optional space for students to stay after school and have a structured environment with academic support.

As a Jesuit school, our goal is to educate the whole student. Therefore, concurrent to academic instruction, our faculty and staff simultaneously work to teach students for all areas of their lives. By incorporating the PLLUSS verbs — Persist, Love, Lead, Unite, Serve, and Seek — across all curricula, our faculty inform students about the importance of being Ignatians: well-rounded, service-oriented, compassionate, and capable of addressing the challenges of our time.

### TUTORING/DASH (DAILY ACADEMIC SUPPORT HUB)

Students who need extra attention attend lunch or after-school tutoring sessions four days per week. Many tutors are St. Ignatius students, fulfilling their community service obligations.



## ABOUT OUR TEACHERS

Each student sees every core teacher daily, allowing faculty to build meaningful relationships with them. Knowing individual students at this level also means teachers have deep insight when they collaborate with other faculty to see what is working best for certain students and groups.

Faculty and staff are present in many areas of the school beyond the classroom. Teachers frequently participate in basketball games on the recess yard, work with students one-on-one during lunch or study halls, and coach CYO sports.

Finally, our faculty benefit from being on the same campus as their St. Ignatius colleagues, constantly learning more from high school teachers on how they can best prepare students for their next steps.
