





The California Department of Education (CDE) writes regarding a petition to the California State Board of Education (SBE) from the Orange County Board of Education (County Board) to transfer the duties and powers of the Orange County Committee on School District Organization (County Committee) to the County Board. Similar transfers of these duties and powers already have taken place in 35 of the counties in California.

We estimate that CDE staff may present the analysis and recommendation regarding the petition to the SBE as early as the November 2023 meeting.<sup>1</sup>

School districts have the ability to petition for the reestablishment of the County Committee pursuant to California *Education Code* Section 4022. As such, the CDE is gathering input from school districts as part of its analysis and recommendation to approve or deny the County Board's petition. Accordingly, it is important that the CDE receive any information that school districts in the county believe should be considered as soon as possible. In order to meet state and federal guidelines, develop consistency and align with the Board's Strategic Goals and Objectives, the plans are updated annually in order to reflect current data, programs, and budgets.

Schools are required to analyze their assessment results and educational practices and develop goals for schoolwide and for targeted student groups. The goals include specific actions, descriptors and timelines. School budgets are then aligned to meet the needs of each school site.

The SPSAs are aligned to the District's Board Goals, Local Education Agency Plan and the Local Control for Accountability Plan (LCAP) for increasing student achievement for all our students, especially English Learners, socio-economically disadvantaged and foster youth students. All of the plans have been developed and approved by the School Site Council at each school, after taking into consideration input from the site-based parent advisory councils.



#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The Westminster School District issued a call for bids for the Finley, Schmitt, and Webber Elementary School HVAC Upgrades Modernization - Bid#23/24-03. Bid advertisements were posted on the PDQ bids website, in building trade periodicals, and in a general circulation newspaper. Potential general contractors were assessed through the prequalification process. At the April 2018 Board meeting, this project was designated as "substantially complex" which provides an allowance for 10% retention.

# **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS:**


The District held a closed bid process on October 17, 2023. After reviewing the bids and conducting a background check, the District has determined that ACC Contractors Inc. is the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for the HVAC upgrade modernization projects at Finley, Schmitt, and Webber Elementary Schools.


Measure T and additional one-time sources will provide funding \$15,980,000.00 for the combined contract. Furthermore, in compliance with Education Code 17604, the Board grants the Superintendent the authority to designate a representative to enter into a contract and approve project modifications or additions in line with the terms of the agreement and Public Contract Code section 20118.4, contingent upon Board ratification. The expected cost based on the construction bid is as follows: DSA fees, inspector of record (IOR), material testing, SoCal Edison service, architecture, project manager, and interim housing for the Finley, Schmitt, and Webber Elementary Schools projects is estimated to be \$22,013,600.00.

# **Community Relations**

#### POLITICAL PROCESSES

The Governing Board has a responsibility to actively advocate fiscal and public policy that supports the district's schools and the children in the community. To the extent possible, the The Board shall be proactive in defining the district's advocacy agenda based on the needs of the district and the direction set forth in the district's vision and goals and the needs of the district and community. The Board's advocacy efforts shall be conducted in accordance with legal requirements.

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The Board may establish reasonable regulations related to Board members and employees engaging in political activity during working hours and on district premises. (Education Code 7055)

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#### **Legislation**

The Board's responsibility as an advocate for the district may include lobbying at the state and national levels. Because local governments also make decisions which impact the district's schools, the Board and the Superintendent or designee shall work to establish ongoing relationships with city and county officials and agencies, and shall inform them of the potential effect of local issues on the schools.

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The Board shall identify issues that will affect its schools and the children in its community, establish goals and priorities for legislative advocacy, solicit community input and adopt legislative positions. The superintendent or designee shall establish a coordinated plan for carrying out the advocacy agenda, including specific activities, target groups or individuals, staff responsibilities and timelines.

In order to strengthen legislative advocacy efforts, the district may work with organizations and coalitions and may join associations whose representatives lobby on behalf of their members. As necessary, the superintendent or designee may draft legislative proposals which serve the district's interests.

The Board may provide fair and impartial information about legislative issues affecting schools and children and shall inform the community about its legislative advocacy activities. However, the Board shall not urge the public to lobby the legislature on behalf of the district.

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#### **Ballot Measures/Candidates**

The Board may study the potential effect of ballot measures on the district's schools. Any Board discussion of the effect of such measures shall include an opportunity for Board members, staff and members of the public to speak on all sides of the issue. Following such study, the Board may adopt positions in support of or in opposition to ballot measures of importance to education. The Board's positions shall be publicized only through normal district procedures for reporting Board actions and in a manner that does not attempt to influence voters.

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No district funds, services, supplies or equipment shall be used to urge the support or defeat of any ballot measure or candidate, including any candidate for election to the Board. (Education Code 7054) District resources shall not be used to disseminate campaign literature or to purchase advertisements, bumper stickers, posters or similar promotional items that advocate an election result.

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The superintendent or designee may use district resources to provide students, parents/guardians and community members with fair and impartial information related to ballot measures, including information about the impact of ballot measures on the district. (Education Code 7054) In preparing or distributing such information, the superintendent or designee shall ensure that the totality of the circumstances, including language, style, tenor and timing, does not expressly advocate passage or defeat of a measure or candidate.

The superintendent or designee may research, draft and prepare a bond measure or other initiative for the ballot, but shall not use district resources to secure signatures in order to qualify the measure for the ballot.

Upon request, Board members and district administrators may appear at any time before a citizens' group to explain why the Board called for an election on a bond measure and to answer

questions. (Education Code 7054.1) If the presentation occurs during working hours, the district representative shall not urge a citizens' group to vote for or against the bond measure. For informational purposes, the superintendent or designee may conduct a poll related to a ballot issue. Such a poll shall not advocate a particular position on the issue.

No district funds, services, supplies, or equipment shall be used to urge the support or defeat of any ballot measure or candidate, including any candidate for election to the Board. (Education Code 7054)'

The Board may discuss and study the potential effect of proposed or qualified ballot measures on the district's schools at an open and agendized Board meeting. The Board's discussion of the effect of such measures shall include an opportunity for staff and members of the public to speak on all sides of the issue. At that meeting, the Board may adopt a position or resolution in support of or in opposition to a ballot measure. The language in any resolution adopted by the Board shall not urge the public to take any action regarding the measure.

The Board's position on a ballot measure, including any resolution, shall be publicized only through normal district procedures and consistent with regular district practice for reporting Board actions. Such publicity shall be for informational purposes and shall not attempt to influence voters.

Individual School Board members may include their name in support of or opposition to a county, city, district, or school measure on a county ballot in accordance with Elections Code 9170.

The Superintendent or designee may use district resources to provide students, parents/guardians, and community members with fair and impartial information related to ballot measures, including information about the impact of ballot measures on the district. (Education Code 7054)

In preparing or distributing such informational material, the Superintendent or designee shall analyze the material to help ensure that it is an appropriate informational activity, provides a fair analysis of the issues, and does not advocate passage or defeat of a measure or candidate.

<u>District resources, including email or computer systems, shall not be used to disseminate campaign literature. In addition, district resources shall not be used to purchase advertisements, bumper stickers, posters, or similar promotional items that advocate an election result or urge voters to take any action in support of or in opposition to a measure.</u>

Political activity related to district bond measures shall, in addition to the above, be subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The Superintendent or designee may research, draft, and prepare a district bond measure or other initiative for the ballot, but shall not use district resources to influence voters or otherwise campaign for the measure.
- 2. Upon request, Board members and district administrators may appear at any time before a citizens' group to explain why the Board called for an election on a bond measure and to answer questions. (Education Code 7054.1)

If the presentation occurs during working hours, the employee representing the district shall not

urge a citizens' group to vote for or against the bond measure.

3. The Board or any individual Board member may file a written argument for the ballot that is either for or against any school measure. (Elections Code 9501)

Legislation

The Board's responsibility as an advocate for the district may include lobbying and outreach at the state, national, and local levels. The Board and Superintendent or designee shall work to establish and maintain ongoing relationships with elected officials, community leaders, and the media in order to communicate district positions and concerns.

The Board and Superintendent shall develop an advocacy action plan to define expectations and responsibilities. This plan may include, but is not limited to, legislative priorities, strategies for outreach to the media and community, development of key messages and talking points, and adoption of positions on specific legislation, regulations, or budget proposals.

In order to strengthen legislative advocacy efforts, the district may work with organizations and coalitions and may join associations whose representatives lobby on behalf of their members in accordance with Government Code 53060.5.

The district may provide fair and impartial information about legislative issues affecting schools and children and shall inform the community about its advocacy activities. However, informational materials about legislation shall not urge the public to lobby the legislature, Governor, or state agencies on behalf of the district.

As necessary, the Board may direct the Superintendent or designee to draft legislative or regulatory proposals which serve the district's interests.

# **Legal Advocacy**

The Board recognizes that some issues are more appropriately addressed judicially rather than legislatively. When a legal issue is likely to set a state or national precedent, the district may join with other districts or parties in order to challenge solve the issue through litigation or other appropriate means.

# LEGAL STATUS REQUIREMENT

In accordance with law, the district shall ask all new employees to provide documentation of employment eligibility. The district shall hire only citizens and aliens who are lawfully authorized to work in the United States. District employment practices shall not discriminate on the basis of citizenship status or natural origin, nor shall they discriminate against any refugees, grantees of asylum, or persons qualified for permanent or temporary residency.

(cf. 4111/4211 - Recruitment and Selection)

Within three days of employment, all new employees shall show appropriate documents which certify that they are legally eligible to work. Documents specified by law which serve this purpose shall be those stated in school district administrative regulation.

For all employees hired after November 6, 1986, Immigration and Naturalization I 9 forms shall be kept as required by law and specified in administrative regulation.

I-9 forms shall be available for inspection by Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) or Department of Labor officers upon request.

Because the documents required to determine employment eligibility may contain confidential information which could affect decisions regarding hiring and/or advancement, the Superintendent or designee shall establish procedures to protect the full confidentiality of any copies of such documents made by the district.

The Governing Board shall ensure that the district employs only those individuals who are lawfully authorized to work in the United States.

The Superintendent or designee shall verify the employment eligibility of all persons hired by completing the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Form I-9, Employment Eligibility Verification, for each individual hired and ensure that the district does not knowingly hire or continue to employ any person not authorized to work in the United States. (8 USC 1324a)

In accordance with law, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that district employment practices do not unlawfully discriminate on the basis of citizenship status or national origin, including, but not limited to, discrimination against any refugees, grantees of asylum, or persons qualified for permanent or temporary residency.

#### Personnel

#### RESIGNATION

The Superintendent or designee is authorized to accept the written resignation and to set its effective date of any employee on behalf of the Governing Board. A resignation presented to and accept by the Superintendent or designee may not thereafter be withdrawn by the employee.

Any district employee who desires to resign his/her position shall submit, in writing, a notice of resignation which indicates the date which the employee intends as his/her last day at work. The Governing Board encourages employees to provide advance notice that is appropriate for the position they hold.

If a certificated employee leaves the employ of the district during the school year without obtaining acceptance of his/her resignation, or leaves before the effective date of the resignation, the Superintendent or designee is directed to report this fact, with supporting evidence, to the Commission for Teacher Preparation and Licensing. The Commission may suspend the credentials of teachers who leave the district in this manner.

The Board authorizes the Superintendent or designee to accept an employee's written resignation and to set its effective date. Once the Superintendent or designee has accepted and set an effective date for this resignation, the resignation may not thereafter be withdrawn by the employee.

The effective date of the resignation shall be a date not later than the close of the school year during which the resignation is received. However, an employee and the Board may agree that a resignation will be accepted at a mutually agreed upon date not later than two years beyond the close of the school year during which the resignation is received by the Board. (Education Code 44930, 45201)

#### UNAUTHORIZED RELEASE OF CONFIDENTIAL/PRIVILEGED INFORMATION

Confidential information generated by the Superintendent or staff shall be under the control of the Governing Board. Under the control of the Board, the Superintendent or designee will determine who is to receive this information for communication purposes. All confidential information so shared with staff is to remain confidential, unless approval is given by the Superintendent or designee to do otherwise.

No information regarding District function and operation shall be withheld from the Board.

The Governing Board recognizes the importance of keeping confidential information confidential. Staff shall maintain the confidentiality of information acquired in the course of their employment. Confidential/privileged information shall be released only to the extent authorized by law.

# **Disclosure of Closed Session Information**

An employee shall not disclose confidential information acquired by being present during a closed session to a person not entitled to receive such information, unless the Board authorizes disclosure of that information. (Government Code 54963)

Confidential information means a communication made in a closed session that is specifically related to the basis for the Board to meet lawfully in closed session. (Government Code 54963)

An employee who willfully discloses confidential information acquired during a closed session may be subject to disciplinary action if he/she has received training or notice as to the requirements of this policy. (Government Code 54963)

The Superintendent or designee shall provide all employees who attend closed sessions a copy of this policy. New employees who may attend closed sessions shall also receive a copy of this policy.

The district shall not take disciplinary action against any employee for disclosing confidential information acquired in a closed session, nor shall the disclosure be considered a violation of the law or Board policy, when the employee is: (Government Code 54963)

- 1. Making a confidential inquiry or complaint to a district attorney or grand jury concerning a perceived violation of law, including disclosing facts necessary to establish the illegality or potential illegality of a Board action that has been the subject of deliberation during a closed session
- 2. Expressing an opinion concerning the propriety or legality of Board action in closed session, including disclosure of the nature and extent of the illegal or potentially illegal

action

# 3. Disclosing information that is not confidential

#### **Other Disclosures**

Any An employee who willfully releases confidential/privileged information about the District, students, staff, or any topic properly confined to a closed session shall be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal from District service.

No employee shall disclose confidential information acquired in the course of his/her official duties. Confidential information includes information that is not a public record subject to disclosure under the California Public Records Act, information that by law may not be disclosed, or information that may have a material financial effect on the employee. any information relating to the Board's employer-employee strategies on matters in negotiation or matters to be placed in negotiation.

Any employee who willingly and for monetary gain uses or discloses confidential/privileged information as defined in Government Code 1098 is guilty of a misdemeanor. (Government Code 1098)

Any action by an employee which inadvertently or carelessly results in release of confidential/privileged information shall be recorded, and the record shall be placed in the employee's personnel file. Depending on the circumstances, the Superintendent or designee may deny the employee further access to any privileged information and shall take any steps necessary to prevent any further unauthorized release of such information.

#### STAFF DEVELOPMENT

The Governing Board recognizes that professional growth is the responsibility of each employee, but opportunity for and encouragement of such growth is the responsibility of the district.

Research and experience demonstrate that efforts to improve the quality of service to all students requires a strong staff development program. The Board recognizes this need to broaden and expand the skills of everyone working in the district and therefore establishes a formal staff development program.

The Superintendent or designee shall coordinate, develop and submit recommendations that will provide for effective staff development.

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The Governing Board believes that, in order to maximize student learning, achievement, and well-being, certificated staff members must be continuously learning and improving relevant skills. The Superintendent or designee shall develop a program of ongoing professional development which includes opportunities for teachers to enhance their instructional and classroom management skills, become informed about changes in pedagogy and subject matter, and strengthen practices related to social-emotional development and learning.

The Superintendent or designee shall involve teachers, site and district administrators, and others, as appropriate, when creating, reviewing, and amending the district's staff development program. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the district's staff development program is aligned with district priorities for student learning, achievement and well-being, school improvement objectives, the local control and accountability plan, and other district and school plans.

The district's staff development program shall assist certificated staff in developing knowledge and skills, including, but not limited to:

- 1. <u>Mastery of subject-matter knowledge, including current state and district academic standards</u>
- 2. <u>Use of effective, subject-specific teaching methods, strategies, and skills</u>
- 3. <u>Use of technologies to enhance instruction and learning, including face-to-face, remote, or hybrid instruction</u>

- 4. Sensitivity to and ability to meet the needs of diverse student populations, including, but not limited to, students with characteristics specified in Education Code 200 and/or 220, Government Code 11135, and/or Penal Code 422.55
- 5. <u>Understanding of how academic and career technical instruction can be integrated and implemented to increase student learning</u>
- 6. <u>Knowledge of strategies that encourage parents/guardians to participate fully and effectively in their children's education</u>
- 7. Effective classroom management skills and strategies for establishing a climate that promotes respect, fairness, acceptance, and civility, including conflict resolution, hatred prevention, and positive behavioral interventions and supports
- 8. <u>Ability to relate to students, understand their various stages of growth and development, and motivate them to learn</u>
- 9. Ability to interpret and use data and assessment results to guide instruction
- 10. <u>Knowledge of topics related to student mental and physical health, safety, and welfare, which may include social-emotional learning and trauma-informed practices</u>
- 11. Knowledge of topics related to employee health, safety, and security

The Superintendent or designee shall, in conjunction with certificated staff and administrators, as appropriate, develop an individualized program of professional growth to increase competence, performance, and effectiveness in teaching and classroom management and, as necessary, to assist them in meeting state or federal requirements to be fully qualified for their positions.

Professional learning opportunities offered by the district shall be evaluated based on the criteria specified in Education Code 44277. Such opportunities may be part of a coherent plan that combines school activities within a school, including lesson study or co-teaching, and external learning opportunities that are related to academic subjects taught, provide time to meet and work with other teachers, and support instruction and student learning. Learning activities may include, but are not limited to, mentoring projects for new teachers, extra support for teachers to improve practice, and collaboration time for teachers to develop new instructional lessons, select or develop common formative assessments, or analyze student data. (Education Code 44277)

The district's staff evaluation process may be used to recommend additional individualized staff development for individual employees.

The Board may budget funds for actual and reasonable expenses incurred by staff who participate in staff development activities.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide a means for continual evaluation of the benefit of staff development activities to both staff and students and shall regularly report to the Board regarding the effectiveness of the staff development program. Based on the Superintendent's report, the Board may revise the program as necessary to ensure that the staff development program supports the district's priorities for student achievement and well-being.

#### **EMPLOYEE SAFETY**

The Governing Board <u>is committed to maximizing employee safety and</u> believes that <u>workplace</u> safety is <u>every employee's the</u> responsibility <u>of every employee</u>. The Board expects all <u>employees to use safe work practices and to report and correct any unsafe conditions which may occur.</u>

Employees shall not be required to work under unsafe or hazardous conditions or to perform tasks which endanger their health, safety, or well-being. Supervisors shall constantly promote safety and correct any unsafe work practice through education, training and enforcement.

Working conditions and equipment shall be maintained in compliance comply with standards prescribed by federal, state, and local laws and regulations.

No employee shall be required or permitted to be in any place of employment which is unsafe or unhealthful. (Labor Code 6402)

The Superintendent or designee shall promote safety and correct any unsafe work practices through education and enforcement.

All employees are expected to use safe work practices and, to the extent possible, correct any unsafe conditions which may occur. If an employee is unable to correct an unsafe condition, the employee shall immediately report the problem to the Superintendent or designee.

The Superintendent or designee shall promote safety and correct any unsafe work practices through education and enforcement.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish an and implement written injury and illness prevention program, and provide employees with access to such program, in accordance with law. The program shall include training in safe and healthy work practices for all employees. (Labor Code 6401.7)

#### Personnel

#### **EMPLOYEE SECURITY**

The Governing Board desires to provide a safe, orderly working environment for all employees. As part of the district's comprehensive school safety plan, the Superintendent or designee shall develop strategies for protecting employees from potentially dangerous persons and situations and for assisting them in the event of an emergency situation.

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(cf. 0450 - Comprehensive Safety Plan)
(cf. 5131.4 - Campus Disturbances)
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The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that employees are informed, in accordance with law, regarding crimes and offenses by students who may pose a danger in the classroom.

The Governing Board desires to provide a safe and orderly work environment for all employees.

As part of the district's comprehensive safety plan, the Superintendent or designee shall develop strategies for protecting employees from potentially dangerous persons and situations and for providing necessary assistance and support when emergency situations occur.

Any person who threatens the safety of others at any district facility may be removed by the Superintendent or designee in accordance with AR 3515.2 - Disruptions.

Any employee against whom violence or any threat of violence has been directed in the workplace shall notify the Superintendent or designee immediately. As appropriate, the Superintendent or designee shall initiate legal and security measures to protect the employee and others in the workplace. Such measures may include seeking a temporary restraining order on behalf of the employee pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure 527.8 and/or a gun violence restraining order pursuant to Penal Code 18150 and 18170.

Upon request by an employee who is a victim of domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking, the Superintendent or designee shall provide reasonable accommodations in accordance with Labor Code 230-230.1 and the accompanying administrative regulation to protect the employee's safety while at work.

The Superintendent or designee may pursue legal action on behalf of an employee against a student or the student's parent/guardian to recover damages for injury to the employee's person or property caused by the student's willful misconduct that occurred on district property, at a school or district activity, or in retaliation for lawful acts of the employee in the performance of the employee's duties. (Education Code 48904, 48905)

The Superintendent or designee shall provide staff development in crisis prevention and intervention techniques, which may include training in classroom management, effective communication techniques, procedures for responding to an active shooter situation, and crisis resolution.

In accordance with law, the Superintendent or designee shall inform teachers, administrators, and/or counselors of crimes and offenses committed by students who may pose a danger in the classroom. (Education Code 48201, 49079; Welfare and Institutions Code 827)

The Superintendent or designee may make available at appropriate locations, including, but not limited to, district and school offices, gyms, and classrooms, communication devices that would enable two-way communication with law enforcement and others when emergencies occur.

# Use of Pepper Spray

Employees shall not carry or possess pepper spray on school property or at school activities except when authorized by the Superintendent or designee for self-defense purposes. When allowed, an employee may only possess pepper spray in accordance with administrative regulations and Penal Code 22810. Any employee who is negligent or careless in the possession or handling of pepper spray shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary measures.

## Reporting of Injurious Objects

Employees shall take immediate action upon being made aware that any person is in possession of a weapon or unauthorized injurious object on school grounds or at a school-related or school-sponsored activity. Employees shall exercise their best judgment as to the potential danger involved and shall do one of the following:

- 1. Confiscate the object and deliver it to the principal immediately
- 2. Immediately notify the principal, who shall take appropriate action
- 3. Immediately call 911 and the principal

When informing the principal about the possession or seizure of a weapon or dangerous device, an employee shall report the name(s) of persons involved, witnesses, location, and the circumstances of any seizure.

#### Personnel

#### **EVALUATION/SUPERVISION**

#### **Certificated Management**

A full and impartial evaluation of professional performance with constructive counseling should be implemented on a regular and continuing basis to upgrade performance.

The evaluation and assessment of the competency of administrative personnel shall be based on:

- 1. Performance of major duties and responsibilities.
- 2. Performance in the achievement of individually established objectives.
- 3. Application of problem solving and decision making skills.
- 4. Application of leadership, planning and organizational skills.
- 5. Performance in the supervision and evaluation of personnel.
- 6. Working staff relationships, interpersonal skills.
- 7. Professional qualities and communication skills.
- 8. Performance of other duties and responsibilities.

The evaluation shall recognize the worth and needs of the individual in the total working environment and shall provide direction toward the improvement of his/her effectiveness.

The Governing Board believes that regular, comprehensive evaluations designed to hold administrative and supervisory staff accountable for their performance are key to improving their instructional leadership and management skills. Evaluations shall be linked to the district's vision and goals and school improvement plans.

Evaluations shall be used to recognize the exemplary skills and accomplishments of administrative and supervisory employees, serve as a criterion for contract renewals, and identify areas needing improvement. When the evaluation indicates areas needing improvement, the Board expects employees to take the initiative to improve their performance and for their supervisors to assist them in obtaining needed job skills.

Administrative and supervisory employees shall be evaluated in accordance with provisions of employee contracts and/or applicable collective bargaining agreements as appropriate.

The Superintendent or designee shall make written evaluation procedures available to all administrative and supervisory employees.

An employee shall be evaluated annually for the first and second years of employment as an

administrator or supervisor in the district, and at least every two years thereafter, unless otherwise provided for in an employee contract or collective bargaining agreement. Evaluations may occur between scheduled periods at the request of the employee, his/her supervisor, or the Superintendent or designee.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish clear, objective criteria for evaluation based on the job responsibilities of each administrative or supervisory position.

Evaluation criteria for certificated school site administrators may be based on the California Professional Standards for Educational Leaders (CPSEL) and also may include, but not be limited to, evidence of: (Education Code 44671)

1. Academic growth of students, based on multiple measures which may include student work as well as student and school longitudinal data that demonstrate academic growth over time

Assessments used for this purpose shall be valid and reliable and used for the intended purposes and for the appropriate student populations. Local and state academic assessments may include, but are not limited to, state standardized assessments and formative, summative, benchmark, end-of-chapter, end-of-course, Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, college entrance, and performance assessments.

- 2. Effective and comprehensive teacher evaluations, including, but not limited to, curricular and management leadership, ongoing professional development, teacher-principal teamwork, and professional learning communities
- 3. <u>Culturally responsive instructional strategies to address and eliminate the achievement gap</u>
- 4. The ability to analyze quality instructional strategies and provide effective feedback that leads to instructional improvement
- 5. <u>High expectations for all students and leadership to ensure active student engagement and learning</u>
- 6. Collaborative professional practices for improving instructional strategies
- 7. Effective school management, including personnel and resource management, organizational leadership, sound fiscal practices, a safe campus environment, and appropriate student behavior
- 8. Meaningful self-assessment to improve as a professional educator, which may include, but not be limited to, a self-assessment based on the CPSEL and the identification of areas of strengths and areas for professional growth to engage in activities to foster professional growth

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9. <u>Consistent and effective relationships with students, parents/guardians, teachers, staff, and other administrators</u>

The evaluation shall be dated and signed by the employee and evaluator. The employee may respond in writing to the evaluation within a reasonable time after receiving a copy of the evaluation. The response shall be attached to the evaluation and placed in the employee's personnel file. Specific details related to the evaluation process for certificated and classified employees can be found in the respective collective bargaining agreement.

#### **Students**

#### **HEALTH CARE AND EMERGENCIES**

The Governing Board recognizes the importance of taking appropriate action whenever an accident or illness threatens the safety, health or welfare of a student at school or during school-sponsored activities.

# **Emergency Information**

To facilitate immediate contact with parents/guardians when an accident or illness occurs, the Board requires parents/guardians to furnish the schools with the current information specified below:

- 1. Home address and telephone number.
- 2. Parent/guardian's business address and telephone number.
- 3. Name, address and telephone number of a relative or friend who is authorized by the parent/guardian to care for the student in cases of emergency when the parent/guardian cannot be reached.
- 4. Local physician to call in case of emergency.

Under Education Code Section 49407, no school district shall beheld liable for the reasonable treatment of a student without the consent of the parent/guardian when the student requires reasonable medical treatment and the parent/guardian cannot be reached, unless a written objection to medical treatment has been filed with the school district.

# **Resuscitation Orders**

District employees are expected to respond to emergency situations without discrimination. If any student needs resuscitation, identified staff, to include School Officer Managers and Health Aides, shall make every effort to resuscitate him/her.

The Board prohibits staff members from accepting or following any parental or medical "Do Not Resuscitate" orders.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all parents/guardians are informed of this policy.

The Governing Board recognizes the importance of taking appropriate action whenever an emergency threatens the safety, health, or welfare of a student at school or during school-sponsored activities.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop procedures to ensure that first aid and/or medical attention is provided as quickly as possible when accidents and injuries to students occur and that parents/guardians are notified as appropriate.

The Superintendent or designee shall ask parents/guardians to provide emergency contact information in order to facilitate communication in the event of an accident or illness.

District staff shall appropriately report and document student accidents.

# "Do Not Resuscitate" Orders

The Board believes that staff members should not be placed in the position of determining whether or not to follow any parental or medical "do not resuscitate" orders. Staff shall not accept or follow any such orders except under the specific written direction of the Superintendent or designee. The Superintendent or designee may only direct a staff member to follow a "do not resuscitate" order if he/she has received a written parent/guardian authorization, with an authorized health care provider statement, and an order of an appropriate court.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that parents/guardians who have submitted a "do not resuscitate" order are informed of this policy.

# **Automated External Defibrillators**

The Board authorizes the Superintendent or designee to place automated external defibrillators (AEDs) at designated school sites for use by school employees in an emergency.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop guidelines for employees regarding these devices and shall ensure that employees receive information that describes sudden cardiac arrest, the school's emergency response plan, and the proper use of an AED. The guidelines shall also specify the placement, security, and maintenance of the AED.

The authorization of AEDs in district schools shall not be deemed to create a guarantee that an AED will be present or will be used in the case of an emergency, or that a trained employee will be present and/or able to use an AED in an emergency, or that the AED will operate properly.
