Learning Opportunities

- 3. In-school, and when possible, out-of-school options relevant to the student's area of strength that are available during the school year.
- 4. Opportunities to accelerate in areas of strength.

Staff Development

The district shall ensure that:A

- 1. Teachers who provide instruction and services for gifted students have a minimum of 30 hours of staff development that includes nature and needs of gifted/talented students, assessing student needs, and curriculum and instruction for gifted students.
- Teachers who provide instruction and services for gifted students receive a minimum of six hours annually of professional development in gifted education.
- 3. Administrators and counselors who have authority for service decisions have a minimum of six hours of professional development that includes nature and needs of gifted/talented students and service options.
