

SUBJECT: INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETIC AND EXTRACURRICULAR ELIGIBILITY

In support of the *Code of Conduct* and Mission of William Floyd Athletics, all students must maintain consistent effort in the classroom. The following Athletic Academic and Extracurricular Eligibility policy applies to all students who are involved in athletics and extracurricular activities:

- a) Special Education Students, English Language Learners, and new transfer student will be automatically reviewed for eligibility through the appeal process.
- b) Students who violate the *Code of Conduct* can be suspended from extracurricular activities.
- c) Students need to be in good standing with attendance at above 90%. Students must have attended the full school day to be eligible to participate.

Middle School7th & 8th Grade Students

Any failures - Student records reviewed by Assistant Superintendent

- a) Progress reports monitored by MS Coach, club advisor, Assistant Principal and Chairperson.
- b) If student shows no growth, teacher contacted and parent/teacher meeting scheduled.
- c) Identify other resources as needed.

High School

Failures only related to graduation requirements will be considered. Advanced courses, electives not needed for graduation and AP courses will not be included.

- a) Entering 9th Grade Students:

One failure of full course (Fall Spoils/Clubs)/one failure of quarter (Winter & Spring) Student records reviewed by Assistant Superintendent.

1. Progress reports monitored by Chairperson for Athletics & Athletic Director, club advisor.
2. No growth by 5 week Progress Report - parent/teacher meeting scheduled and suspended from the team.

3. Identify other resources as needed.

Two or more failures - Appeal Process Required: Assistant Superintendent, Athletic Director, Athletic Chairperson, club advisor, and Assistant Principal.

b) 10th Grade Students:

One failure - Appeal Process Required: Assistant Superintendent, Athletic Director, Athletic Chairperson, club advisor, and Assistant Principal.

c) 11th and 12th Grade Students:

No failures - Failures only related to graduation requirements will be considered. Advanced courses, electives not needed for graduation and AP courses will not be included.

If extenuating circumstances - Appeal Process Required: Assistant Superintendent, Athletic Director, Athletic Chairperson, and Assistant Principal.
