#### Academic Topics to Keep in Mind

#### What is a Transcript?

A transcript reflects your courses taken and the final semester grade received.

#### What is a GPA?

Grade Point Average. Weighted and unweighted

#### What is a UC? CSU?

- UC University of California (examples: UC Berkeley, UCLA)
- CSU California State University (examples: San Francisco State, CSU Long Beach...)
- Private/Out of State Colleges and Universities(examples: St. Mary's, University of San Francisco, Stanford...)
- Undergraduate: a student in a 4 year university who has not yet earned a bachelor's degree

#### What is A-G?

The A-G/college entrance requirements are a sequence of high school courses students must complete with a C or better to be *minimally* eligible for admission to UC/CSU and other 4 year universities.



#### **CPHS Graduation Requirements**

English - 4 years 40 credits

Math - 3 years 30 credits

Must pass <u>Algebra 1</u>

Science - 2 years 20 credits

• 10 credits Life Science

• 10 credits Physical Science

Social Studies - 3 years 30 credits

VAPA, World Language, CTE 20 credits

Need two of the three areas

Electives 60 credits

Physical Education - 2 years 20 credits

#### **UC/CSU A-G Requirements**

A: History - 2 years (World History & US History)

B: English - 4 years

C: Math - 3 years, 4 years recommended

• (Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra II or Financial Algebra)

D: Laboratory Science - 2 years, 3 years recommended

• Life Science (Biology, Physiology, Zoology, etc.)

• Physical Science (Chemistry, Earth Science, Physics, etc.)

**E**: LOTE (Language Other than English) - 2 years

• Level 2 is required, Level 3 is recommended

F: VAPA (Visual and Performing Arts) - 1 year

**G**: College Prep Elective - 1 year (Gov/Econ, Math, Science, or LOTE goes here)

#### Struggling in class? Need academic support?

Community Colleges

4- year Institutions (UC/CSU's, Out-of-state, etc.)

Trade or Vocational School

Earn an A.A. or A.S. (associate's degree), certificate, or licensure

Earn a undergraduate degree which is a B.A. or B.S. (bachelor's degree) MA or MS- Masters Degree PhD= Doctorate Degree

Earn a certificate (not a degree)

## California Community College System

- 116 Community Colleges in CA
  - Earn a degree (Associate's Degree), transfer to a 4-year university, or earn a certificate
- Students do not apply...students <u>register</u> for community colleges
- DVC Free Tuition Program: To receive free tuition for up to two academic years, CCC,
  - DVC, and LMC students must:
    - 1) Complete FAFSA or Dream Act and
    - 2) Enroll in a minimum of 12 units per semester
- No SAT or ACT is required for registration



#### University of California (UC)

#### 9 UC Campuses throughout California

#### **Requirements:**

- Minimum 3.0 gpa (10th & 11th grade only)
- UC application (same application for all campuses)
- 4 Personal Insight Questions (pick 4 out of 8)
- \$80 fee per campus

NO letters of recommendation
No SAT or ACT

**Application filing period: November 1 - 30** 



#### California State University (CSU)

#### 23 CSU Campuses throughout California

#### **Requirements:**

- Minimum 2.5 gpa (10th-11th grade only)
- Application (same application for all campuses)
- \$70 fee per campus

NO letters of recommendation NO essay

**Application filing period: October 1- November 30**

Private Colleges and Universities

GPA and course requirements vary greatly, check each college website!

#### All schools require:

- Common application (apply to multiple schools at same time) or college specific application
- Send official test scores\*\*
- Pay application fee
- Personal statement or essay
- Letters of recommendation (0-3 max)

**Application filing periods vary!**

#### College Bound Student Athletes

- ►D1 and D2 University's: Register for **NCAA** Eligibility Center *no later than your Junior Year!* 
  - ► Eligibilitycenter.org
- ► <u>Complete a total of 16 Core Courses in:</u>
  - ► English, Math, Science, Social Science, Foreign Language
  - ▶ 10 of the 16 core must be completed <u>PRIOR</u> to Senior year
  - ► Earn over a 2.3 GPA (in your 16 core)
  - ► SAT/ACT Scores
- ► Not all courses are approved for NCAA-work with your Academic Counselor (especially online courses!)
- **▶**See Mr. Walters for more information

#### Honors & Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

- ☐ Honors and AP classes have accelerated and rigorous curriculums.
- ☐ Honors gives a GPA bump, but no college credit.
- □ AP Courses have an AP exam and students **sometimes** receive college credits for the course, as well as a GPA bump.
- □ UC & CSU limit the number of weighted classes to 4, with no more than 2 classes from 10<sup>th</sup> grade.



Remember...QUALITY OVER QUANTITY!



#### Scheduling Reminders

- Schedule changes only happen within the first 3 weeks of the Fall semester <u>AND</u> the first week of the Spring semester.
- Schedule changes are only permitted for students:
  - Missing a necessary class/credits for graduation
  - Enrolled in the wrong course
  - A class was repeated and needs to be adjusted so that credits are not missed
- Course requests cannot always be guaranteed
- One class change may adjust your entire schedule
- Students cannot request a schedule change for a different teacher!
