## **General Eligibility Requirements**

SC HOPE, LIFE, and Palmetto Fellows Scholarship, SC Need-based Grant, and Lottery Tuition Assistance Program

- US citizen/legal permanent resident\*
- South Carolina resident\*
- No felony convictions \*\*
- No second or subsequent alcohol/drug misdemeanors
- Not in default of any state or federal loans
- Enroll in a degree-seeking program at an eligible SC institution

<sup>\*</sup>This must be determined by the institutions at the time of high school graduation and college enrollment.

<sup>\*\*</sup> Excluding Lottery Tuition Assistance Program

# 2024-25 FAFSA DELAYED UNTIL DECEMBER 2023

- FAFSA Simplification Act was passed in Dec. 2020
- Federal Department of Education has not released the FAFSA live date, only Dec. 2023
- Significant FAFSA changes for 2024-25
- Recommend students and parents set-up their FSA IDs now in preparation for FAFSA going live in Dec. 2023.



### S.C. Need-based Grant

- Student must complete the FAFSA each year and be determined to have 'financial need' based on Title IV
- Generally awarded on a "first-come-first serve" basis
- Can be used at any 2-year or 4-year public institution\*
- Must be considered a degree seeking student
- Up to \$3,500 / yr for full-time or \$1,750 / yr for part-time

# Additional Programs

### **Foster Care Youth**

Up to the maximum \$3,500 / yr NBG award *PLUS* up to an additional \$2,000 / yr

\*Student needs to work with the Financial Aid Office, DSS, and CHE

### **College Transition Program**

Programs at 5 eligible S.C. institutions for students with intellectual disabilities:

- College of Charleston
- Clemson University
- University of South Carolina- Columbia
- Winthrop University
- Coastal Carolina University
- Scholarship: Up to \$10,000
- Grant: Up to \$10,000\*

<sup>\*</sup> Student must demonstrate 'financial need' by Title IV guidelines

\* Award amount may vary each term depending on availability of funding

# SC HOPE Scholarship

### **Eligibility:**

No application Process. Institution reviews final high school transcript.

3.0 Cumulative GPA

Must attend an eligible SC 4-year institution

(based on the SC UGP upon high school graduation)

Up to \$2,800 (for the year)

For the 1st academic year only (2 terms)

# SC HOPE to LIFE

• SC HOPE

LIFE

After 1st academic year:

Earn an average of 30 credit hours;

**AND** 

3.0 LIFE GPA

# LIFE Scholarship

### Eligibility at a 2-year institution

• **3.0 Cumulative GPA** (based on the SC UGP) upon high school graduation

### Eligibility at a 4-year institution

- Earn 2 of the following 3 requirements:
  - 3.0 Cumulative GPA (based on the SC UGP) upon high school graduation
  - 1100/SAT or 22/ACT
  - Rank in the top 30% of the graduating class (if applicable)

# LIFE Scholarship Basics

- NO application process
- Not required to begin college immediately after high school\*
- Can *earn* eligibility after 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, or 3<sup>rd</sup> academic year
- Student has until the end of an academic year (end of summer term) to earn the required GPA / credit hours

## LIFE Terms & Award Amount

### Terms of Eligibility

- 2-year Institution
  - 4 semesters for a two-year degree program
  - 6 semesters for a three-year degree program
- 4-year Institution
  - 8 semesters for a four-year degree program
  - 10 semesters for a five-year degree program

### Up to \$5,000 per academic year

- Not to exceed to the Cost of Attendance
- Must attend an eligible SC institution

<sup>\*</sup> Student must be in an approved degree program

<sup>\*\*</sup> Scholarship is still operating on a continuous clock

## LIFE GPA

Dual Enrollment and college enrollment while in high school and/or prior to enrolling in college


Grades and credit hours earned at colleges and universities (in-state, out-of state, abroad)

# LIFE Continued Eligibility

# Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Application Periods

- School Counselor driven application process
- Any eligible student will need to be part of the Early or Late Award application process during their year of graduation

### **TWO** opportunities to apply:

- Early Award: May 1 April 15 (end of 3<sup>rd</sup> year in HS)
- Late Award: May 15 June 30 (end of 4th year in HS)

\*a student cannot use Early Award documentation for the Late Award\*

\*\*a student cannot apply or earn the PFS once they have graduated high school\*\*

# Palmetto Fellows Scholarship General Eligibility Requirements

- Rank in the top 6% at the end of the 10<sup>th</sup>, or the 11<sup>th</sup>, or the 12<sup>th</sup> grade academic year\*; and
- Earn a 1200 on the SAT/25 on the ACT (through the June test administration of the graduating year); and
- Earn a 3.5 cumulative GPA (based on the SC UGP)


\*Schools must have an official policy on rank that has been reviewed by Commission staff for compliance with the established Regulations in order for students to utilize the standard eligibility criteria.

OR

### **Alternate Criteria** (without regard to rank)

- Earn a 1400 on the SAT/31 on the ACT (through the June test administration of the graduating year); and
- Earn a 4.0 Cumulative GPA (based on the SC UGP)

## Student Notifications



- For the student to receive scholarship funds they
   MUST complete the DESIGNATION FORM
  - This is the SOLE responsibility of the student
  - The student is provided this form via email to the email listed on the electronic application\*
- Early Award: Late-January ongoing
- Late Award: Mid-August
  - Student tuition bill <u>WILL</u> be due prior to being awarded the Palmetto Fellow Scholarship.
  - Students <u>CAN</u> accept the LIFE Scholarship and use it towards their bill.
- Deadline to submit Designation Form: August 31st

\*Please make sure students are checking their spam/junk email folders.

# Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Award Amounts

- The student <u>MUST</u> attend an eligible 2 or 4-year institution no later than one year after high school graduation. Student needs to notify CHE that they are utilizing a 'Gap Semester/Year.'
  - A student <u>CANNOT</u> earn credit hours during the 'gap' period
  - Not enrolling within one year immediately following high school graduation <u>forfeits the student's PFS</u> <u>eligibility</u>.
- A "gap year" may <u>ONLY</u> be taken between high school graduation and prior to initial enrollment
  - A break in continuous enrollment will result in a loss of eligibility.
- A student who attends an out-of-state institution can use any remaining terms of the PFS should they transfer to an eligible SC institution and meet the PFS renewal requirements

# Palmetto Fellows Continued Eligibility Requirements

3.0 cumulative institutional GPA

(Cannot transfer grades from other colleges)

Earn 30 credit hours <u>each</u> academic year

Does **NOT** include AP, IB, Dual Enrollment, CLEP or exempted credit hours

# LIFE & Palmetto Fellows Scholarship STEM Enhancements





Starts the student's 2<sup>nd</sup> academic year (6 semesters) at a 4-year institution only Must Earn 14 credit hours of math and/or science by the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> academic year

AP, IB, Dual Enrollment, CLEP and Exempted courses)

Up to an additional \$2,500

Must be enrolled in an eligible major at their home institution

# Students with Documented Disabilities

Register with the Office of Disability/Accessibility Services

May be eligible for accommodations

May be eligible for a reduced course load

# General State Scholarship & Grant Information

No South Carolina State Scholarships or grants may be used at an out-of-state institution at any time.

### Academic Common Market

Allows for South Carolina residents who are enrolled in specific programs at out-of-state institutions to be charged only the applicable in-State tuition by the institution in which the student is enrolled

### S.C. Tuition Grants Commission

Provides Need-based Grant assistance to eligible South Carolina students obtaining an initial undergraduate degree who are attending, on a full-time basis, eligible independent non-profit in-state colleges.

### Rank & State Scholarship Eligibility



- For the purposes of the LIFE and Palmetto Fellows Scholarship (PFS) programs two students may not occupy the same rank.
  - LIFE Scholarship: Top 30% of the graduating class (NOT rounded up to the next whole number)
  - **PFS:** Top 6% (rounded up to the next whole number)



### **Early Graduate**

(Senior graduating mid-year > not during the Spring Cohort)

### LIFE Scholarship

• For scholarship eligibility the student <u>CANNOT</u> use rank as an eligibility criterion.

### **Palmetto Fellows Scholarship**

- Student can qualify with class rank from the end of the 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grade year.
- Palmetto Fellows: can only apply during the Early Award Period <u>prior to</u> completing their high school graduation requirements.

### **Graduating Early**

(Student graduates academic year(s) early > graduates with Spring Cohort)

### SC HOPE / LIFE Scholarship

 Eligibility is based on the end of the academic year with the student's "new" graduating class

### Palmetto Fellows Scholarship

- Early Award Application Period can use the end of 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grade rank, must use end of 11<sup>th</sup> grade GPA
- Late Award Application Period can use the end of 10<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade rank, must use end of 12<sup>th</sup> grade GPA

### Year-Round Scholarships

Eligible SC HOPE, LIFE and Palmetto Fellows recipients



Earn continued eligibility by the end of the Spring term



Eligible to use funds for a Summer term



\*Enrolled full-time

\* Uses a term of eligibility

\*Eligible for Fall, if eligible at the end of Spring
