



### **Retention and Promotion Policy**

#### To be promoted to the 9th grade

Student must be promoted by middle school

#### To be promoted to the 10th grade

Student must have earned a total of 5 credits including 1 Math and 1 English

#### To be promoted to the 11th grade

Student must have earned a total of 11 credits including 2 Math and 2 English

#### To be promoted to the 12th grade

Student must be able to graduate by the end of the current school year. The subsequent summer term is NOT counted as part of the current school year.

### **9th Grade Year is CRITICAL**

WHO WILL GRADUATE CAN BE ACCURATELY PREDICTED BASED ON COURSE GRADES IN

#### 9TH GRADE.

- Students who are on-track at the end of their 9th grade year—earn at least a quarter of the credits needed for four-year graduation and receive no more than one "F" in a core course—are as much as four times more likely to graduate from high school than their off-track peers. In fact, the 9th grade on track metric is more predictive of a student's likelihood of graduating than race, ethnicity, poverty level and prior test scores combined. (Allensworth, 2013)
- For every core course that a 9th grade students fails, their chance of graduating in four years decreases by 30%.
   (Nield, 2009)
- 70-80% of all students who failed 9th grade will not graduate from high school. (Wyner et al. (2007). Achievement Trap: How America is Failing Millions of High-Achieving Students from Lower-Income Families. Jack Kent Cooke Foundation.)

# Attendance Requirements

### **Attendance Expectations**

#### **Failure Due to Attendance**

In order to receive credit for a high school course, a student must attend at least 85 days (for a 90-day semester course) or 170 days (for a 180-day year course) or **the equivalent for block or hybrid scheduling.** Students who miss more than the days listed below may not receive credit for the class even if they have a passing grade in the class.

5 DAYS for a 1 credit course 3 DAYS for a 1/2 credit course An "FA" (Failure due to Attendance) will appear on their high school transcript.



#### **Excused vs Unexcused**

**EXCUSED** - An absence is **excused** when a student has been out of school for a **"lawful"** reason and has submitted a note to the school explaining the absence.

**UNEXCUSED** - An absence is unexcused when a student fails to submit a note for an absence or when a student has been out of school for an "unlawful" reason.



#### Lawful vs Unlawful

LAWFUL - Illness; doctor/dental appointment; death/serious illness in immediate family; recognized religious holiday of their faith; student court appearance; prearranged absences for other reasons at the discretion of the principal

**UNLAWFUL** - Willfully absent from school without the knowledge of parent/guardian; absent without acceptable cause with the knowledge of their parent/guardian.

### Seat-time recovery

#### Failure Due to Absences = Seat -Time Recovery

In order to receive credit for a high school course, a student must attend at least 85 days (for a 90-day semester course) or 170 days (for a 180-day year course) or the equivalent for block or hybrid scheduling. The board may grant approval of excessive absences in accordance with board policy.

Students who miss more than the days listed below may not receive credit even if they are passing the class. An "FA" (50) will appear on their high school transcript.

- 5 days for a 1.0 credit course
- 3 days for .5 credit course
- All absences, excused or unexcused, count toward these limits.

You will receive an email stating that you are at risk for a failure due to attendance and that you are required to make up seat time.

Seat-time recovery is offered Mon, Wed, and Fri mornings in room 141 with Mr. Hudak. Please get your breakfast and quickly report to to Mr. Hudak.

Seat-time Flex Session Recovery is also offered by request in room 131 with Mrs. Plummer. Some students are automatically enrolled in the Seat-time recovery flex period and must report to room 131 before the tardy bell rings. You may also send an email to <u>kplummer@sdoc.org</u> if you would like to have additional Flex sessions scheduled to clear up your attendance quicker.
