In addition to Coach Bobby Rawson's historical volleyball victory Monday night, two other Crockett County sports teams enjoyed a successful day.

The high school girls soccer team blasted Milan 9-0 to improve its season record to 6-3-1. Despite a painfully bruised toe on her preferred kicking foot, senior Kristin Lewis drilled five goals past the Lady Dawgs goalkeeper to pace the rout. Emme-Grace Martin added a pair of scores for Crockett, with Casey Thornton and freshman Kendra Juarez accounting for one each. Rebecca Waddey and Dani Rios contributed two assists apiece, and Charity Greenhill had another.

Crockett's middle school softball squad clobbered Gibson County in a doubleheader sweep by a combined score of 40-1, winning the first game 17-0 and the second 23-1.

In the opener, shortstop Wesley Thornton went 3-for-3 with three RBIs and led off the Lady Cavs' first-inning attack with a long triple off the left-center field fence. Ella Hayes and Addie Hoover each had two hits and three RBIs for the winners, who also received three runs knocked in and two perfect innings of pitching from Emmalynn Medlin.

In the second game, Emilee Chandler was the victorious pitcher with three innings of one-hit ball, while also belting out three hits and scoring four runs. First baseman Ariana Mosier paced the offense, going 4-for-4 with five RBIs. Haley Leforgee also scored four times and was 2-for-2 with a pair of walks as well.

The triumphs boosted Crockett's season record to 12-2 and gave the team nine consecutive wins.
