

EDUCATIONAL ALTERNATIVES FOR EXPELLED STUDENTS

The District shall provide those educational services that the District deems appropriate for an expelled student, upon request of a student or the student's parent/guardian. Educational services means any of the following types of services that provide instruction in the areas of reading, writing, mathematics, science and social studies:

- (a) tutoring services;
- (b) alternative educational programs, including on-line programs authorized by state law; or
- (c) career and technical education programs.

The educational services will be designed to enable the student to return to school or successfully complete the GED, whichever is deemed appropriate by the District.

Upon the request of an expelled student or the student's parent/guardian and as the District deems appropriate, the District may also provide to an expelled student some of the services the District provides to students at risk of expulsion pursuant to C.R.S. §22-33-204 (refer to file: JKG).

The District shall determine the amount of credit the student shall receive toward graduation for the educational services provided.

The District may further suspend or expel a student who is receiving educational services because the student was expelled. Except as required by federal law, a student who is expelled while receiving educational services shall not receive further services until the student completes the period of his/her second suspension or expulsion.

In accordance with state and federal law, all expelled students who receive educational services will be included in the District's pupil enrollment, including those expelled prior to the October count date.
