

SAT School Day: As of 2016, SJUSD provides the SAT Exam free of charge to all Juniors students each year. For the Class of 2023, 328 students took the SAT with a mean total score of 1022.

### **Specialty Courses**

**CSU Expository Reading & Writing** (ERWC): Students complete a CSUdesigned curriculum that focuses on identifying and critiquing authors' arguments in expository text.

**Exploring Computer Science (ECS):** Students complete a NSF-designed curriculum that includes an introduction to human computer interaction, problem solving, web design, programming, data analysis, and robotics.

Latino Literature: Students may take this ethnic studies course during their junior or senior year. While learning the same skills taught in their English class, students examine their place in their community while studying the work of Latinx authors.

Man in the California Environment (BioSite): Students teach field ecology in three local elementary schools and lead teams of 4th graders in weekly field expeditions through a local watershed preserve.


