How would you like to engage with D11 Students: Pre-K through Post-Secondary?

Classroom Presentation: Pre-K through 12th Grade

- An employer visits a classroom to speak/give a presentation to students about your industry, and the variety of careers and pathways your company offers, your journey, job duties, and responsibilities.
- 30-40 minutes
- Size of group varies but usually 20-30 students.
- This is a great opportunity to inspire students by telling your story

Site Visit: Pre-K through 12th Grade

- Students come to your facility, take a tour, hear from professionals, and learn more about the career pathway(s).
- 2-3 weeks to prepare and plan for the event. (We will support you when creating the outline).
- The size of the group depends on the size of the facility.
- 2-4 hours per visit
- This opportunity allows students to get an overview of your industry and the different career pathways your business offers.

Industry Sponsored Project: 6th Grade through 12th Grade

- The objective of an industry-sponsored project is to create a unique, high-quality, authentic, educational opportunity for students. It allows students the opportunity to apply what they've learning in the classroom, transfer it to the real-world industry projects, and feel a sense of accomplishment and pride.

Job Shadow: 10th Grade through 12th Grade

- Students come to your facility to **observe** and follow professionals in the industry. They can ask questions, watch, and learn.
- Usually, 1-2 students
- ½ day or full day per job shadow
- This is a great way for students to see firsthand what a day in the life in this particular industry/pathway looks like.
- Students are to never be left alone or unsupervised.

Internship: 11th Grade through 12th Grade

- Students spend 60-120 hours on site to test their interest in a career within that industry, occupation, and/or employer.
- Interns should be included in daily activities that may not normally be open to entry level employees, such as staff meetings, client consultations, or other work-related events.
- Students receive high school credit for completing internships.
- Provides learning experiences

Apprenticeship: 11th Grade through Post-Secondary

- Students will spend over 1,000 hours (depending on apprenticeship) with an employer.
- Provides students with hands-on career training, education, and a paycheck.
- Apprentices can earn college credit for their apprenticeship and gain skills and credentials needed to work in industry.
- D11 can connect you to an Apprentice Outreach Specialist through the Department of Labor that can help your company federally register your apprenticeship.
