Remembrance

The Remembrance Assembly this morning was, once again, a moment of reflection. The children showed a real sense of occasion and acted with great maturity.

During Art this week, children in Year 3 have been looking at the different poppies that are worn on Remembrance Day. In particular, they discussed the significance of the purple poppy. The children have learned that purple poppies were introduced back in 2006 by the charity Animal Aid as a way of remembering the animals that lost their lives at war. The charity started the appeal because it felt the animals that die at war are often forgotten and unsung heroes.

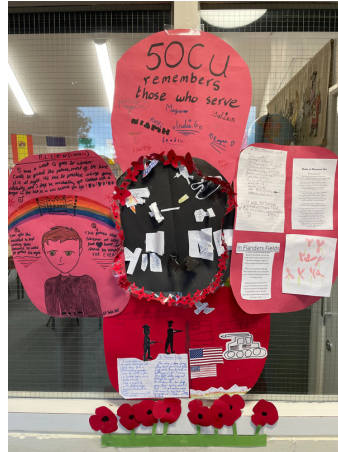
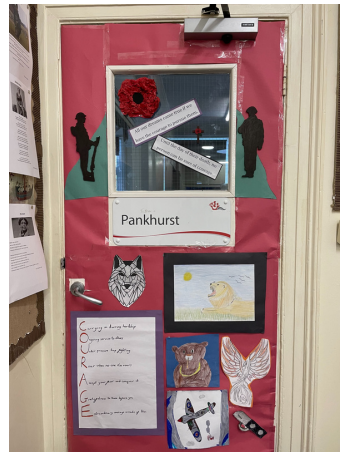

Remembrance Doors

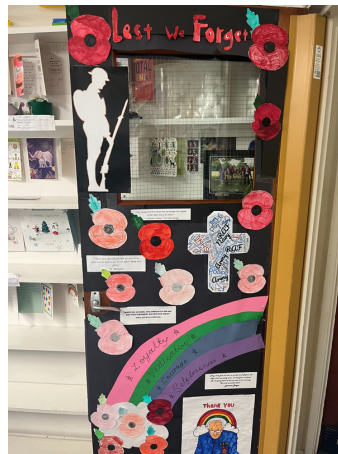
This year, we have been marking Remembrance by decorating our classroom doors on the theme of Remembrance. The children have really enjoyed working collaboratively for their Forms.
