The Golden Spatula

This past week, students in Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grade were introduced to "The Golden Spatula" behavior system in the cafeteria. Miss Padden reviewed with each class "the great 8". The "Great 8" are the 8 expected lunchroom behaviors at Primary School.

They are:

- 1. Clean Up Your Mess
- 2. Throw your garbage in the Trash Can
- 3. Use Walking feet
- 4. Sit in your Seat
- 5. Respect Personal Space (no popping others' "space bubbles")
- 6. Use a "Level 2" Voice Volume (which is a "speaking" voice)

8. Follow Directions

When students in 1st and 2nd grade are observed engaging in any of these 8 expected behaviors, staff in the cafeteria will award them with a raffle ticket. At the end of the lunch period, students will write their first name on their tickets. Then the tickets are placed in their grade's jar. On Friday morning, 3 names will be drawn from each jar (3 names from 1st grade and 3 names from 2nd grade.) If their name is called, they will walk down to the office, have their photo taken with the "Golden Spatula", receive a shout-out in Mrs. Goho's weekly newsletter, and then select a prize from Miss Padden's prize box to take home! Winners will have their photo displayed on our cafeteria bulletin board! The more tickets you have in the jar that week, the greater the chances that your name will be called! Each day is a new opportunity to "get caught". Who will win next week?


During our "Golden Spatula" assembly, we even had some winners! The winners from the assembly this week were:

Students in kindergarten are also working on earning the "Golden Spatula", but in a slightly different way. Kindergarten students who are observed engaging in expected behaviors in the cafeteria will be given colorful tickets. Each kindergarten class has been assigned a different color. If you're in Mrs. Blodgett's class, you will be earning purple tickets. If you're in Mrs. Debasitis', class you will be earning blue tickets. Miss Waldon's students are earning red tickets, Mrs. Kowal's students are earning orange tickets, and Mrs. Troll's students are earning yellow tickets! At the end of the lunch period each day, students will place any tickets they have earned in the kindergarten jar. When the jar is filled with 1,000 (yes, one-thousand!) tickets, the entire kindergarten class will earn a special surprise celebration! Our kindergarten jar is already getting full!

Each week, Miss Padden will count the tickets, and share the total for each class and the total number of tickets in kindergarten. Whose class will get the MOST tickets each week? Kindergarten students will be able to see their class's progress with a graph in the cafeteria! And if their class has the most tickets that week, there may even be MORE surprises in store! Kindergarten is working hard to fill that jar! As we get closer and closer to our goal of 1000 tickets (yes, one-thousand!) we will be sure to keep you updated about our first BIG surprise!



Virtual Whole School Morning Meeting

This morning we had a virtual whole school morning meeting to review the playground expectations. Ask your student to share playground expectations that make sure we keep everyone safe and happy. They might name:

- Stay in the teacher's play area
- Wood chips must be left on the ground
- Use kind words and respect others
- · Keep hands and feet to yourself
- Watch out for and help other children
- Take turns and share equipment
- Listen to all adults, even those adults who aren't your teacher
- Keep the playground clean
- Chalk can only be used on the sidewalk
- Slides are for sitting and sliding down
- The ladybug is for crawling under and climbing on no standing at the top, no pulling people's arms and legs
- On the bouncer, sit on the chairs and in the middle, hands and feet must stay on the bars, only four students in the middle
- Spinner chairs are for one child at a time, if someone asks you to stop spinning them you need to stop
- Listen for your teacher's signal and line right up when recess is all done

Arrival and Dismissal

Arrival

All **4PK-2nd grade students** will enter at the main entrance of school and must be to school by 8:00.

- Students can be dropped off as early as 7:15.
- Breakfast will be served from 7:30-8:10.
- Buses unload students at 7:40.

All 3PK students will enter at the side door at 9:00 for the AM program or 12:30 for the PM program.

Dismissal

Dismissal changes must be made *before 1:00pm*. Parent pick-up will begin at 2:15pm each day at the following doors based on last name. Please make sure we have the name of the person picking up and that person has a *driver's license for identification*.

- A-C at the ELC doorway on the parking lot side
- D-H at the back playground door
- I-Q at the first door on the left in the driveway between the HS & PS
- R-Z at the second door on the left in the driveway between the HS & PS

All 3PK AM and PM students will exit at the side door at 11:30 for the AM program and 3:00 for the PM program. Our 3PK students are dropped off and picked up in the small Primary Bus Loop during the following times: 8:45-9:00, 11:20-11:35, 12:20-12:30, and 2:50-3:05. Please consider parking in a different location so that you aren't trapped in the loop.

!Tardy Arrival (after 8:00am) Change in Practice!

If your child arrives at school after 8:00am, he/she is considered tardy. Please walk your child into the school main entrance to complete an excuse. Then staff will give your child a tardy pass and he/she can walk to class independently. Please note this is a change in practice in order to ensure student safety in the parking lot and to keep accurate attendance records.
