

■ Letter from the Counselors

Hello DPS Families! Over the last 4 weeks, students have been busy continuing to build their skill set.

In **Pre-K**, we learned the steps for not interrupting and staying on task! Step 1 is to think about what you want to say, Step 2 is to raise your hand and wait, and Step 3 is to share your idea! Then we listened to a story and shared our ideas about the story. We also had a chance to practice working with partners.

Engage your child by asking:

- What are the three steps to not interrupt someone? (Think, raise hand, share)
- Why should we not interrupt? (It's not kind)

In **<u>kindergarten</u>**, we learned about our emotional bank account and using nice talk. We practiced using nice talk with our friends by giving compliments. We also brainstormed and practiced using nice talk in real-life scenarios.

Engage your child by asking:

What are the two steps we can take when using nice talk? (use a friendly look, use a friendly voice)

In <u>1st grade</u>, we talked about our Circle of Control. Leaders can identify things they have control of, and they don't pay attention to the things they don't have control over. Together we made a list of things we DO and DON'T have control over. Some things on the DO list included: my words, my actions, my clothes, who I'm friends with, my emotions, and what I do when I'm upset. Some things on the DON'T list included: the rules at school, who's in my family, and what other people say and do.

Engage your child by asking:

- What is inside your circle of control? (My actions, my words, how much effort I put into my work, how I treat others.)
- What is outside of your circle of control? (What other people do and say, the rules, what's for dinner, what time I go to bed.)
- Why is it important to only focus on what we have control over? (We only focus on things we can control or change. We can't change things we don't have control over)

In **<u>2nd grade</u>**, we learned about problem solving and the four problem solving steps. We practiced solving real-life problems using the problem solving steps together and then discussed other problems and what we might do in these situations.

Engage your child by asking:

• What are the four problem solving steps?

- T think of solutions
- E explore consequences
- P pick the best solution

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Arrival

All **4PK-2nd grade students** will enter at the main entrance of school and must be to school by 8:00.

- Students can be dropped off as early as 7:15.
- Breakfast will be served from 7:30-8:10.
- Buses unload students at 7:40.



All 3PK students will enter at the side door at 9:00 for the AM program or 12:30 for the PM program.

Dismissal

Dismissal changes must be made **before 1:00pm**. Parent pick-up will begin at 2:20pm each day at the following doors based on last name. Please make sure we have the name of the person picking up and that person has a **driver's license for identification**.
