#### Cover the first few weeks of school ...

It is typical for children to experience:

- Separation anxiety
- Fatigue
- Hunger
- Heightened emotions

To support your child, you may want to:

- Share your own school stories (include what made you nervous and what happened that made it a positive experience)
- Plan out special time before/after school where you can give your child 100% of your time
- Build in downtime when children get home from school
- Consistent and early bedtime routine
- Consistent morning routine (consider visuals)
- Have students ride the bus to school in the morning or give a quick hug goodbye at drop off and depart
- Pack the backpack (including snack) the night before and have it ready by the door
- Remind them that home is boring because you have "work" and/or younger siblings wish they could be at school

#### Arrival

All **4PK-2nd grade students** will enter at the main entrance of school and must be to school by 8:00.


- Students can be dropped off as early as 7:15.

#### 🖴 Review the playground

Please review the very important playground rules:

- Walk in the playground boundary or on the sidewalk.
- Running is encouraged in the large open grassy areas.
- Wood chips must be left on the ground.
- All equipment must be used in a safe and appropriate manner. For example, slides are for sitting and sliding down, climbing only on the ladybug (no standing at the top), hands and feet stay on the bars of the bouncer with only four students in the middle, spinner chairs for one child (and no pushing friends on the chairs).
- Everyone should be treated with courtesy and respect through language and behavior.
- Children must respond to the redirection of all adults in a supervisory role.
- Keep the playground clean by picking up garbage.
