For the first time in history, CCISD is asking voters to consider approving three cents on its maintenance and operations tax rate as well as school bond proposals. The three propositions on the November 7, 2023 ballot will offset the increasing cost of daily operations, improve school conditions and student safety, and fund instructional technology. Homeowners 65 years and older with a homestead exemption will not see a tax increase. Introducing New Limited Open Enrollment Program for 2024-2025 School Year

Grandparents who live within District boundaries may enroll grandchildren who live outside CCISD attendance zones



Clear Creek ISD announces the launch of a Limited Open Enrollment Out-of-District Transfer program for the 2024-2025 school year. Through this program, CCISD education programs and opportunities will be available to students who reside outside the District's attendance boundaries and who meet select criteria. Enrolled grandchildren will be assigned to the campus within the school zone of the CCISD resident grandparent.

Students who will attend pre-kindergarten through grade 12 in the upcoming school year and meet one of the following criteria are invited to apply to attend a CCISD school:

- Grandchildren of grandparents who live within CCISD's attendance boundaries. Visit ccisd.net/district-map to enter your address in School Zone Finder.
- Students of parents or guardians who work on Federal property but live outside CCISD boundaries. This includes NASA civil
 servant employees, NASA contractor employees and employees supporting programs and operations at Ellington Field Joint
 Reserve Base.

Students who transfer into the District will have the opportunity to join the CCISD family and take advantage of:

- Exemplary education, teachers and curriculum
- Exceptional cocurricular programs such as Robotics
- · Comprehensive and competitive Visual and Performing Arts and Athletics programming
- Career and Technical Education programs including engineering, dentistry, culinary arts, welding and more

To participate in the Limited Open Enrollment Out-of-District Transfer program, guardians and grandparents must apply during the application window and provide documentation that they meet the eligibility requirements. Transportation is not provided through the Limited Open Enrollment Out-of-District Transfer program.

Enroll Your Grandchild in CCISD Today

There is limited space available to ensure for no overcrowding of buildings or classrooms. The deadline to apply for acceptance for the 2024-2025 school year is February 1, 2024.

Voters to Consider Tax Rate Election and School Bond Election on November 7



On August 21, the Clear Creek Independent School District Board of Trustees voted unanimously to include a Voter-Approval Tax Rate Election (VATRE) and a Bond Election on the November 7 ballot. Registered voters residing within the Clear Creek ISD attendance zone will be asked to consider three propositions that would generate additional funding to support educational programs, staff salaries, facility repairs and equipment replacements, and technology.



Proposition A

Funding for Staff, Safety & Student Programs

- \$17.5 million in day-to-day operations funding annually
- \$0.3 Cent M&O Tax Rate Increase per \$100 valuation



Proposition B

Funding for School Improvements

- \$265 million in school bond proposal
- \$0.0 Cent I&S Tax Rate Increase per \$100 valuation



Proposition C

Funding for Instructional Technology

- \$37 million in technology bond proposal. Short term bonds.
- \$0.0 Cent I&S Tax Rate Increase per \$100 valuation

Prop A will fund

- Student Programs
- Teacher and Staff Salaries
- School Security Officers
- Fuel and Utilities
- Property Insurance

Prop B will fund

- Roofs and HVAC
- Surveillance Cameras
- Cybersecurity System
- Playgrounds
- Classroom Furniture
- Fine Arts and Athletic Equipment

Prop C will fund

- Student and Teacher Laptops
- Special Education Technology
- Career and Technical Technology
- Classroom Projectors
- Library Technology

"We look forward to bringing these important items before the voters for consideration. The three propositions have been developed through a comprehensive process involving stakeholders across Clear Creek ISD. It is how we best make decisions regarding the education of our community's children, and I encourage everyone to learn more about these propositions and then vote this November," said Arturo Sanchez, CCISD Board President.

A CCISD Facility Advisory Committee and a CCISD Strategic Budget Team met separately throughout the spring and the summer to analyze the facility and budgetary needs across the district.

The Facility Advisory Committee initially recommended a \$614 million bond program, recognizing it has been six years since a school bond election was held. The Board of Trustees accepted its recommendation and sought public input on the timing of the bond recommendation during a series of community meetings as well as a phone survey.

The Board agreed to bring a \$302 million bond which would address priority repairs, equipment replacements, life and safety systems, and instructional and infrastructure technology. The proposed \$302 million bond would be funded through the current Interest and Sinking Tax Rate of \$0.27.

The CCISD Strategic Budget Team was formed in late May when it became clear the Legislature was not going to increase what is known as the Basic Allotment. This is the per-student funding school districts receive from the State to fund salaries, transportation, school safety, student programs, insurance, and other day-to-day costs. The \$6,160 per-student allocation has not increased since 2019 yet the costs of day-to-day operations have gone up due to inflation. To account for the increased cost of operations, the Legislature would have to increase the allotment by \$1,000. It adjourned in May without any increase.

The CCISD Strategic Budget Team recommended the District seek voter approval for three pennies on the Maintenance and Operations Tax Rate to balance the budget. This is the first time Clear Creek ISD is seeking a Voter-Approval Tax Rate Election (VATRE).

Taxpayers will see a 17-cent tax rate reduction under the Legislature's historic property tax relief bill also on the November ballot. The VATRE is for three of those cents to generate \$17.5 million in additional revenue to pay for the increased cost of education in Clear Creek ISD. Under the current funding system, the State matches up to 80% in state dollars. All those funds stay local and are not subject to recapture or what is commonly referred to as 'Robin Hood'.

Election Day is Tuesday, November 7, and early voting begins Monday, October 23.

Clear Creek ISD has the fourth lowest maintenance and operations tax rate in Texas and the third lowest in the Greater Houston region.














Student Success & Gratitude Showcase
