Dear Parents/Guardians,

Today, our student body gathered to express our deepest gratitude and pay tribute to the brave men and women, as well as their families, who have selflessly served our nation. Today was a day to honor our Veterans; a day to recognize their sacrifice, resilience, and unwavering commitment to protecting the values and privileges afforded to us.

We had seventy-one Veterans and service members representing all branches of service who spent the day with us. Our Service Club students served as ambassadors to our building, greeting our Veterans as they arrived and escorting them to assigned panels on each team. During this time, our students were able to pose questions: "Why did you enlist? Where did you travel the world? What was the scariest moment you had while serving? Do you still have contact with people you met while serving?" A school wide moment of silence was held at 11:00 a.m. which signified The Armistice, an agreement to end the fighting of the First World War. As part of celebrating our Veterans, staff and students provided a wonderful luncheon followed by a magnificent ceremony in our gymnasium, featuring music from our choir and band. During this ceremony, students recognized their appreciation for our Service Men and Women.

Additionally, the two eighth grade kivas, *Big Blue* and the *Whelks*, walked to the nearby Old Stone Church Burial Ground to honor veterans laid to rest there.

We also acknowledged a significant milestone-the birthday of the United States Marine Corps; for 248 years, the Marines have demonstrated courage, discipline, and loyalty.

I would like to thank Veterans, both past and present. Their dedication has left a lasting mark on our nation's history. We are profoundly grateful for your service, and we were grateful to share and express our thanks today.

I would also like to thank members of our faculty for making this day so special: Mr. Cruz, Service Club Advisor and Mrs. McMillian, Administrative Assistant for organizing/scheduling today's events, with the support of other administrative assistants. The music and art departments for their audio/visual coordination, the social studies department for providing important historical knowledge to students, our language arts teachers and Mrs. Balboni, ELA Coach for supporting students with their essays and selecting our essay winner.
