
Community Speaker Event

New York Times best-selling author, Dr. Michael Thompson, will be joining the Southridge community on November 15th for an immersive day of discussions based on insights from his book, "The Pressured Child: Helping your Child Find Success in School and Life". In his presentation, Dr. Thompson describes the psychological journey that children experience during their thirteen years in school. He reminds parents that children are almost never judging themselves by grades; they are always monitoring their own development and constantly searching for three things: connection, recognition, and a sense of power. He illustrates how children find those in many different arenas of school life. We are very excited to welcome Dr. Thompson and to learn together as a community. Jonathan's Southridge story began in September 2000 when he walked through our doors for the first time as a grade 1 student, embarking on a journey



that would shape his future. Among the exceptional graduates of the Class of 2012, Jonathan Yu stood out with his passion for basketball and an inspiring journey.

FALLING IN LOVE WITH THE GAME

It was in those early years that Jonathan's love for the game of basketball began to blossom. The basketball court quickly became his second home, a place where he learned valuable life lessons, discipline, and the importance of teamwork. "I fell in love with basketball when I was about 8 years old at Southridge being coached by Mr. Anderson," says Jonathan.

Sharing a special bond with close-knit teammates and coaches made for memories that will last a lifetime. "Going on team trips was a huge highlight for me, and even now at 29 years old those teammates and I can still rattle off jokes from those trips, and reminisce about the laughs we shared," recalls Jonathan. "My favourite games were when we played in front of the school for the "Big Storm" tournament. We had Mr. Burrage and the band there playing, and all our family and friends cheering us on – those are moments I will not forget."







COACH A'S MENTORSHIP

A pivotal figure in Jonathan's Southridge experience was Mr. Steve Anderson (better known as 'Coach A'), his basketball coach since grade 3. "Mr. Anderson made a big impact on me," says Jonathan. "He's someone I've known since grade 3, he was my grade 5 homeroom teacher, he coached my brother, and then I was fortunate enough to be coached by him; After graduating from Southridge, I coached alongside him, so our relationship has really come full circle," shares Jonathan. "Coach. A has continued on in my life as a friend. We had him over at my parent's house for a BBQ and caught up this past summer." Jonathan attributes much of his success and personal growth to the guidance and wisdom he received from Mr. Anderson. "He's definitely a mentor to me and has shaped who I am."

FIGURING OUT HIS PATH

"It took me a while to figure out my path after leaving Southridge I didn't have the traditional post-secondary experience," shares Jonathan. He explored various avenues before finally settling on pursuing a degree in kinesiology at the University of the Fraser Valley, with a specialization

in teaching and coaching. It was during his time at UFV in 2015 that he reunited with his former coach, Mr. Anderson, to help coach the Southridge Basketball team. He quickly stepped into the role of Assistant Coach of the Southridge Senior Boys' basketball team. "We ended up winning the championship that year, so that was huge, and that made me fall in love with coaching, going to the gymnasium, working with the guys, and trying to accomplish something," says Jonathan. On drives from UFV to Southridge, Jonathan reflected on where his path was going, "The best part of my time in University was when I was back in the Southridge gym coaching, and it made me reevaluate my career path, and what I really enjoyed doing."



A BLESSING IN DIGUISE

It was the unexpected turn of events in 2020, during the global pandemic, that truly defined Jonathan's journey.

Quarantined with his family after their return from holidays, and no longer being able to coach Southridge basketball, Jonathan decided to utilize his time by delving deep into the study of basketball. He began to explore the science behind the sport, developing innovative ideas and approaches to the game. "I had a



conversation with my now-fiancé at the very start of the pandemic and said, 'I think we can come out of this as better people, if we take time to reflect and invest in ourselves.' Life slowed down and we could reevaluate what was important to us," recalls Jonathan, who developed a desire to learn about coaching and basketball at that time. "I revamped everything I had already learned from Coach A, and started building on different ideas and learning about the science behind coaching and basketball. I was studying skill acquisition, motor learning, how your brain learns movement, and how I could apply it to basketball. It was interesting learning this science-approach coaching style and it inspired me to figure out this more efficient way to get players to learn," shares Jonathan.

CAREER TAKE-OFF

This newfound passion led to an extraordinary opportunity. In May 2022, while Jonathan was finishing his teaching degree at UBC, a renowned coach in Italy, known for his science-based coaching methods, announced that he was looking for assistants. Jonathan secured a remote position with him on some projects in Italy.

This past January, Jonathan signed a contract with Fleetwood Park Secondary School, ready to take on a teaching position. A week after signing his contract, he found himself on a plane chasing his dreams on his way to Italy. "I ended up dropping everything and flying to small town Italy, about an hour outside of Milan to help coach the first basketball team to fully adopt science behind everything we do," says Jonathan. "We were reading peer reviewed articles, and applying this research to the basketball

court with a team of 20 players from 13 different countries," says Jonathan. It was a dream come true, an opportunity to share his wisdom, and learn from the best in the field. "It was an amazing experience working under that coach, he's now working with the



Portland Trail Blazers (NBA) and for the London Lions. Having coaching experience and working with him really boosted my resume and opened new doors," shares Jonathan.

The journey didn't end in Italy. Jonathan's passion for coaching took him to Vietnam, where he now resides. "I'm coaching youth teams and small group training with youth all the way up to pros," shares Jonathan. "I have a goal to revamp Vietnamese basketball, the sport is really new to Vietnam so it's a unique opportunity to coach these players with a modern, scientific-based approach," says Jonathan, who has an unwavering commitment to helping young men reach their full potential.





ALUMNI INVOLVEMENT



Despite being over 10,000 kilometres away, Jonathan remains a dedicated Southridge alumnus. He is currently participating in the ASK program as a mentor to one of our grade 11 students, and when he is in town, he has been on campus as a substitute teacher. Jonathan is also a key participant in our annual Alumni Basketball Tournament. "We all want to come back to see Coach A. It doesn't matter when you played for him - we all consider ourselves 'One Team'," says Jonathan. "I think back to being in



elementary school and having grade 11 and 12 students come out to our home games, and those are guys that I still talk to, even though we never shared anything other than having the same coach, we're still connected, so when we're able to all come together for the Alumni Basketball Tournament it's a cool feeling," shares Jonathan.

AN INSPIRING MEMBER OF THE SOUTHRIDGE COMMUNITY

Jonathan Yu's journey is a testament to the power of passion, investing in yourself, and the enduring impact of Southridge. He exemplifies the qualities that make our alumni community so special, and we are incredibly proud to have him as part of the Southridge family. Jonathan's story is a reminder that no matter where life takes you, the lessons learned at Southridge are always with you, and the bonds forged here endure forever. As for Jonathan's next steps, he says: "Who knows what will happen in the future or where this career will lead me. It's crazy to think where picking up a basketball in the Southridge gym has taken me and where I will go with it."
