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Safety Data Systems Report (SSDS) Overview



The SSDS collects two types of information from school districts:

- ❖ Incidents of violence; vandalism; harassment, intimidation, or bullying (HIB); weapons offenses, substance offenses; and any other incident leading to a student removal from school; and
- ❖ HIB trainings and programs.

The Mountain Lakes School District is required to report its data to the Department of Education twice a year - once in the fall and once at the end of the school year.
