Life Science (Biology, Physiology, Zoology, etc.)

Physical Science (Chemistry, Earth Science, Physics, etc.)

E: LOTE (Language Other than English) - 2 years

Level 2 is required, Level 3 is recommended

F: VAPA (Visual and Performing Arts) - 1 year

G: College Prep Elective - 1 year (Gov/Econ, Math, Science, or LOTE goes here)

Earn a certificate (not a degree)

There are over 4,200 degree-granting post-secondary institutions in the US!

California Community College System

- 116 Community Colleges in CA
 - Earn a degree (Associate's Degree), transfer to a 4-year university, or earn a certificate
- Students do not apply...students <u>register</u> for community colleges
- <u>DVC Free Tuition Program</u>: To receive free tuition for up to two academic years,
 CCC, DVC, and LMC students must:
 - 1) Complete FAFSA or Dream Act and
 - o 2) Enroll in a minimum of 12 units per semester
- No SAT or ACT is required for registration



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University of California

9 UC Campuses throughout California

Requirements:

- Minimum 3.0 gpa (10th & 11th grade only)
- UC application (same application for all campuses)
- 4 Personal Insight Questions (pick 4 out of 8)
- \$80 fee per campus

NO letters of recommendation

Application filing period: Oct 1 - Nov 30

Requirements:

- Minimum 2.5 gpa (10th-11th grade only)
- Application (same application for all campuses)
- \$70 fee per campus

NO letters of recommendation NO essay

Application filing period: October 1- November 30

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Private Colleges and Universities

GPA and course requirements vary greatly Check each college website!

All schools require:

- Common application
 - (apply to multiple schools at same time) or college specific application
- Send official test scores**
- Pay application fee
- Personal statement or essay
- Letters of recommendation (0-3 max)

Application filing periods vary!



Historically Black Colleges and Universities - HBCUs



Some HBCU's:

- Alabama A&M University
- Clark Atlanta University
- Florida A&M University
- Howard University
- Langston University
- Tennessee State University



Historically Black colleges and universities are institutions of higher education founded to educate Black students. In the 19th century, when many colleges and universities refused to admit Black applicants, HBCU's offered those students a route to higher education. Any student can attend!

There are 107 colleges in the United States that are identified by the US Department of Education as Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs).

Out of State Colleges



Non-residents often have additional or different requirements at public universities

WUE: Western Undergraduate Exchange

Students can apply for reduced tuition at participating schools within 15 Western States

Examples of some colleges:

- □ Recommend taking tests in the Spring of 11th grade
- ☐ Some schools are Test Blind or Test Optional
 - Make sure you check to see if you need the test

Benefits of Trade/Vocational Schools

Lower Cost....

It usually costs more than \$20,000 per year to attend a four-year university.

Multiply that by the four or five years it takes to complete a bachelor's degree.

• Faster Graduation Timeline....

- Shorter programs that you can typically finish in 2 years
- Fewer Admission Requirements....
 - o English and Math
- Small Class Sizes....
- Real-World Experience....
 - Most trade school programs require you to complete hands-on training (while getting paid) such as an externship or clinical internship before you can graduate.

College Bound Student Athletes

- ▶ Register for NCAA Eligibility Center no later than spring Junior Year
 - ► Eligibilitycenter.org
- ▶ Complete a total of 16 Core Courses in:
 - ► English, Math, Science, Social Science, Foreign Language
 - ▶ 10 of the 16 core must be completed PRIOR to Senior year
 - ► Earn over a 2.0/2.3 GPA (in your 16 core)
 - ► SAT/ACT scores not required by NCAA (Check your school's requirements though)
- ► Not all courses are approved for NCAA
 - ► Work with your School Counselor (especially online courses!)
- ► Need to repeat a class?
 - ► See your School Counselor for options, NCAA does NOT accept APEX!



What Should Your Student Be Doing Right Now?

Your Sophomore & Junior years are the years to raise your GPA!

What should students be doing right now

- Meet with your counselor and create a 4 year plan together
- Take challenging classes
- Think about taking the PSAT your Junior year
- Get involved with extracurricular activities, volunteer, find internships
- Go to a college fair or career fair in your area
- Tour college campuses
- Shadow people in jobs that interest you
- Make an appointment with the College Advisor (Mr. Walters) to discuss your options
- Research Financial Aid options

Plan campus visits

- Visit when school is in session.
- Attend College rep Visits that happen at CP.
- Sign up online for campus tour and do the tour!
- Students should stay overnight, if offered
- Eat in the dining commons
- Attend a class
- Pick up a school paper
- Reflect on the experience and evaluate the campus
- Take pictures
