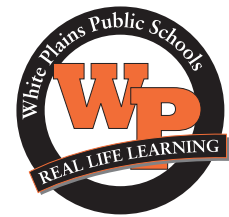

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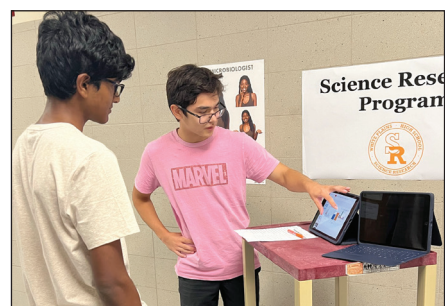
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Perseverance and Presentation Skills in the Science Research Program

The Science Research Program at WPHS, a 3-year Honors Science elective, is a unique opportunity for students to experience the rigor and rewards of real scientific research while still in high school. Working with a mentor, participants choose a topic of interest and construct an original experiment. Along the way, they learn exploratory and bibliographic research, increase their ability to work independently, and to develop perseverance among other critical skills. Recently, students have been practicing their verbal presentations in preparation for this year's science fairs and year-end Science Research Symposium.

Seven White Plains High School seniors were named Commended Students in the 2024 National Merit Scholarship Program. Students are recognized for their exceptional academic

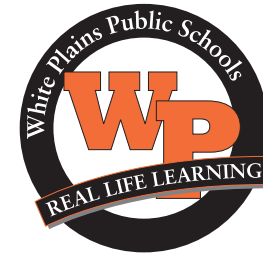

The District is also pleased to welcome 45 new teachers and 32 new civil service members this school year.

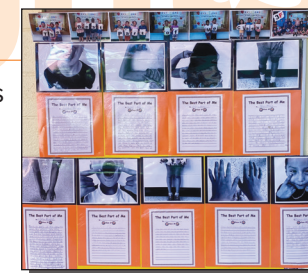
Valerie Daniel Joins the BOE

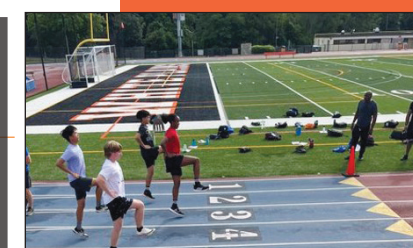
WPHS Athletes Commit to Top College Sports Programs

Now in its second year, 160 WPHS student athletes took advantage of the Summer Sports Academy, which increased from three to four days a week in 2023. Students arrived at 7am to participate in speed, strength and injury-prevention training. A virtual academic component was offered in the evenings, with an introduction to the SAT/ACT, study skills and college essay writing prep. Guest speakers gave talks about leadership, character, perseverance, and overcoming adversity. Assistant Athletic Director Mike Chappas shared that the summer's hard work is already paying off on the field, especially in the reduced number of injuries.
