
It also allows you to earn college credit when you are just in high school

The 2023-2024 year has started fresh for the VEX robotics team. Many teams have designed a new prototype for their robot for Over Under, this year's competition game. Teams must work with metal and screws to construct their optimal design. The objective for this year's game is that the game's pieces, triballs, must be placed in the opponent's goals, and you must try to get as many triballs as you can in a one-minute driver period. Teams can get additional points by winning a 15-second autonomous period where if teams complete certain tasks without controlling their robot, they win an autonomous win point for the round. For the endgame, teams can hang their robot on a pole, and depending on the average, teams can earn a maximum of 20 points or as little as 2 points. If these competitors win the regional



Food with Freya.....Something for the Season Gingerbread men cookies

Ingredients

3 cups flour

2 teaspoons McCormick Ginger, Ground

1 teaspoon McCormick Cinnamon, Ground

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/4 teaspoon McCormick Nutmeg, Ground

1/4 teaspoon salt

3/4 cup butter, softened

3/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar

½ cup molasses

1 egg

1 teaspoon McCormick Pure Vanilla Extract

Directions

Mix flour, ginger, cinnamon, baking soda, nutmeg, and salt in large bowl.





Beat butter and brown sugar in a large bowl with an electric mixer on medium speed until light and fluffy. Add molasses, egg, and vanilla; mix well. Gradually beat in flour mixture on low speed until well mixed.

Press dough into a thick, flat disk. Wrap in plastic wrap. Refrigerate for 4 hours or overnight. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Roll dough on a lightly floured surface to a thickness of 1/4 inch. Cut into gingerbread men's shapes with a 5-inch cookie cutter. Place gingerbread men 1 inch apart on ungreased baking sheets.

Bake in the preheated oven until the edges of the cookies are set and just begin to brown for 8 to 10 minutes. Cool on baking sheets for 1 to 2 minutes, then remove to wire racks to cool completely.

Decorate cooled cookies as desired. Store cookies in an airtight container for up to 5 days.
