Online Courses

Through Fayetteville Technical Community College and Virtual High School, a variety of online courses are offered to Upper School Students who have maximized our curriculum or are seeking unique elective opportunities that we do not offer. Online courses are taken under faculty supervision. They are included on our transcript and clearly are noted as an online course.

Honors & Advanced Placement Courses

University of North Carolina at Pembroke Partnership

Beginning in the 2023-2024 school year, Upper School students are eligible to take two University of North Carolina at Pembroke history classes on the campus of Fayetteville Academy to receive dual enrollment credit.

Seniors at Fayetteville Academy are eligible to take two online courses through FTCC to receive additional college credit.

HLT and LEAP STEAM Smartlabs

Students through all grade levels have access to three state-of-the-art STEAM SmartLabs, the only ones of their kind in our area. SmartLab enables learners to engage in project-based work to explore and utilize various technologies. This includes working with robotics, coding and 3D printing. Through this experience, students develop and hone important real-world skills such as problem-solving, collaboration, project planning and communication.

The Ryan Patrick Kishbaugh Center for Writing and Creative Learning

The primary focus of the Writing Center is to assist students with writing—all types of writing, all types of writing assignments, and all stages of the writing process.

The Intern Program is the heart of the Writing Center. Writing Interns are juniors and seniors at the Academy who are exceptional writers and passionate about writing. They are trained to be professional writing tutors and work to help their peer in the writing process.

Grade Point Average, GPA, is computed by semester using the following scale (no one can earn a 5.0):

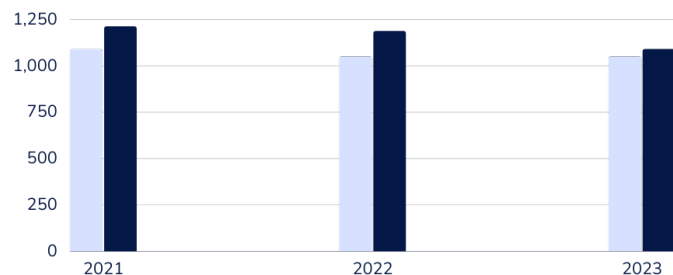

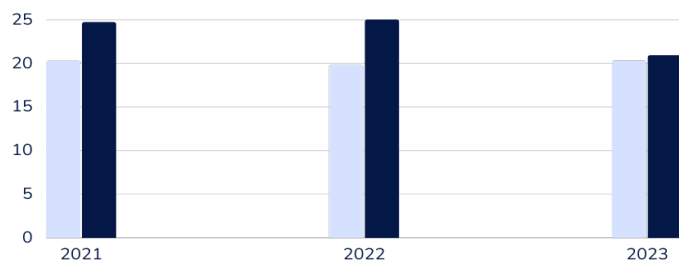
