Letter from the Principal

The past two weeks were marked by great horror and heartbreak, with lives forever altered by the events that took place in Lewiston on October 25.

As I've tried to process and comprehend what has occurred, I have also found myself noticing moments that give cause for hope: a staff member stepping in for another who was struggling, students and staff sharing stories about connections to the events Lewiston, students checking up on each other as they pass through halls, and a school that, under incredibly difficult circumstances, came together in support of one another — as a community — in response to a terrible tragedy.

The empathy, compassion, and resilience that I've witnessed has been a ray of light and inspiration in dark days. Robert Frost once wrote, "the best way out is through." After what I've seen from our staff and students, I have full confidence we will make our way through together.

I wish you and your families a safe and happy month of November, and a joyful start to the holiday season.

Election Day Learning for SHS Students

Election Day will be held in the Town of Scarborough on Tuesday, November 7, 2023. Since Scarborough High School is the voting site for the Town, all SHS students will attend classes remotely that day. Only high school students will have remote learning on this day. All other district levels will operate as usual.

This will be an asynchronous remote day for SHS classes, meaning we will not be running a coordinated class schedule for the day. Attendance will be taken once through Advisory only. Every Advisor will be posting or emailing a Google Form to their Advisees by 8:30am on the morning of November 7. To be marked present for the day, students need to complete and submit that form by 10am. Any student who has a legitimate reason for why that form was not submitted by 10am should contact the Advisor.

As our Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs take place offsite, we will still be running buses for students in Westbrook Regional Vocational Center (WRVC) and Portland Arts and Technology High School (PATHS) programs. As usual, all CTE



students are expected to take SHS buses to and from their CTE site on November 7:

- The **AM bus** from SHS will leave for WRVC and PATHS at 7:40am and return to SHS around 10:45am.
- The **PM bus** from SHS will leave for WRVC at 10:00am and return to SHS around 1:15pm.

Students or parents/guardians of CTE students who need a ride to SHS to catch the AM or PM bus or a ride home when they return to SHS from their program should contact Mr. Coombs (tcoombs@scarboroughschools.org) so that we can arrange for appropriate transportation. As some of these CTE program times may conflict with the plan for attendance outlined above, Mr. Coombs will be taking care of attendance for all CTE students.

Department will provide bag lunches for all students to take home
on Monday, November 6, 2023. Students who wish to pick up a
lunch to bring home, please stop by the main lobby on your way out
of school at the end of the day on Monday.



5th Annual Voter Registration Drive






Scarborough Kiwanis Club Fundraiser for Socks, Gloves, Mittens & Hats

SHS Civil Rights Club hosts guest performer and educator, Ahmad Kafari

On October 12th, the SHS Civil Rights Club hosted Portland-based pianist and rhythm bones-wielding beatmaker Ahmad Kafari. Kafari's music synthesizes his love of ambient piano music, instrumental hip hop, and acoustic percussion. Kafari performed



pieces from Miles Davis and of his own composition. He also provided CRC members with their own bones (an historic percussion instrument) and taught them basic rhythmic maneuvers. Kafari's vocation is to teach bones to his listeners at his performances, sharing pieces of their complex and fraught history while workshopping basic rhythmic techniques with his audiences over his original beats. "I think of being a musician as a private, public journey. My intention is to care for myself and to cultivate a personal relationship with music that is expressive, healing, and that serves my needs at the time. And perhaps through that act of expression and of making a statement, I can make a connection with you."

SHS Art Club is Back!



Engineer Class Completes Rube Goldberg Design Challenge

SHS Engineering students recently completed a Rube Goldberg design challenge. They had to incorporate 5 energy transfers and 3 simple machines chosen at random to create a complicated machine to complete a simple task. This picture shows the work of one group who designed a machine to turn off a light. They had to



use a lever, inclined plane, and screw as their simple machines and Gravitational Potential Energy

(PE) to Kinetic Energy (KE); Sound to KE; KE to Gravitational PE; PE to Sound; and Chemical PE to KE. These students constructed their own screw from PVC pipe and cardboard tubes, inclined planes from hot wheels tracks, a holder for an electronic motor and fan from legos, a pulley system from K'NEX and a lever from K'NEX.


