

WHAT PARENTS CAN DO BEFORE MOVING

- *Tell your child's teacher and principal that your child is moving and give them the new address*
- *Explain to the school the reason for your move*
- *Ask if your child would be eligible for transportation*
- *Keep copies of your child's records, including immunizations*

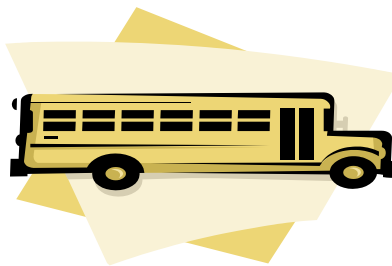
Education Rights for Children and Youth Lacking Fixed, Regular and Adequate Housing

- You do not need a permanent address to enroll your child in school.
- Your child cannot be denied enrollment when school records or other documentation are not immediately available.
- Your child may be able to remain in the same school (school of origin) even if you move.
- Your child may be eligible for transportation services to and from the school of origin.
- Schools must provide you with a written explanation if a placement dispute occurs, and you may appeal the school's decision.
- Your child automatically qualifies to participate in free breakfast and lunch programs.
- Your child has the right to participate in extracurricular activities and all federal, state, or local programs for which he/she is eligible.
- Unaccompanied youth have these same rights.
- Your child may be eligible for school supplies, including uniform assistance.

WHAT QUALIFIES MY STUDENT FOR THESE SERVICES?

Families who are living in situations that are not “normal” can qualify for services. If you are living in one of the following situations, your student can receive services:

- Doubled up with another family due to an emergency economic condition or a crisis situation (because you have no place else to live).
- Living in a motel or hotel (because you have no place else to live).
- Living in a shelter such as the New Hope Shelter, Interfaith Hospitality Network, Colorado House, etc.
- In a transitional housing program like Partners in Housing or Lutheran Family Services.
- Living in a motor home that is not suitable for living.
- Living on the street or in your car or anyplace not designed as a living space.
