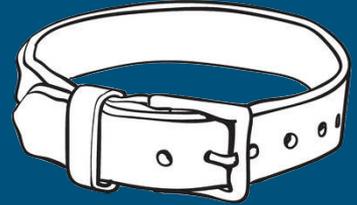

  - November 27, 2019 - Teacher Institute & Student Engagement



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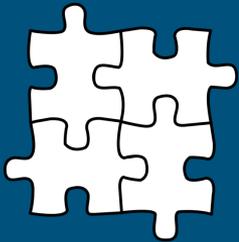
# How We Got Here...



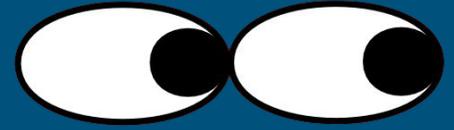
- Gower begins i3 Learning Initiative- giving students devices for Anywhere, Anytime, Any Device Learning

- Students Self-Select one eLearning Module from Music, Art or P.E.

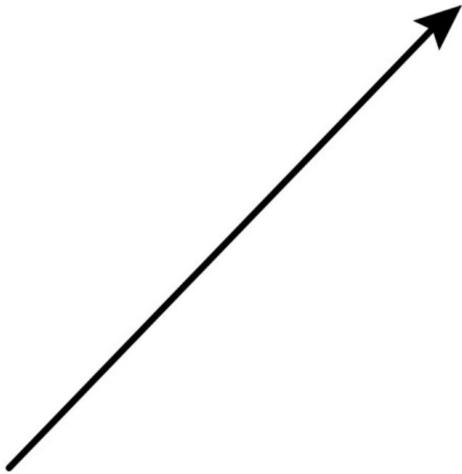


- Time Spent approximately 120 minutes.

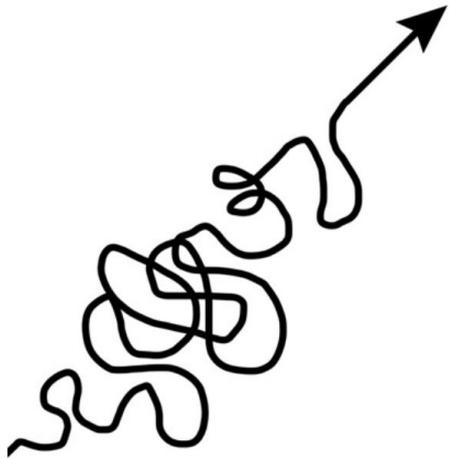

- Giving students an 'introduction' to online coursework / real-world application
- Having done it multiple times, it is becoming 'the norm.'

  - (Student Devices, No Wifi @ Home)
- Families who *choose* not to participate
- Looking at the lesson through the eyes of a parent- especially at K-2 and SpEd levels

# Where Are we Headed for 2019-2020?

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- Used a planned Teacher Institute Day as an eLearning Day for students.
  - 90% Student Participation Rate
  - Served as a “training” for students and families of eLearning Day procedures- similar to how we practice drills
- Now, we anxiously await inclement weather to continue our use of eLearning procedures.
