# COUNSELING PROGRAMS

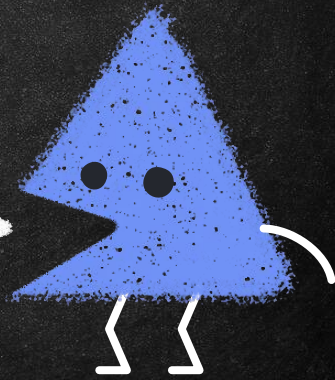
- State Requirements - Texas Education Code (TEC 33.005-33.007) describes school counseling programs and counselor responsibilities.
- Content Areas - Programs should reflect 4 content areas:
  - Interpersonal Effectiveness
  - Intrapersonal Effectiveness
  - Personal Health and Safety
  - Post-secondary Education / Career Readiness





## COUNSELING PROGRAMS CONT.

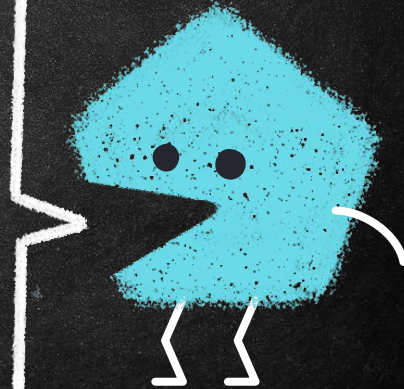
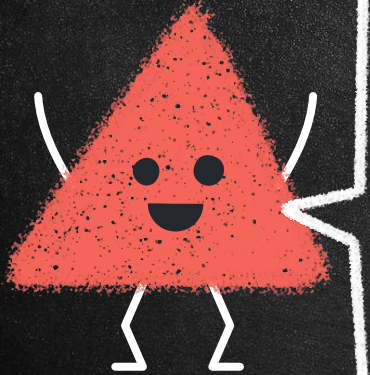
- CSCP (Comprehensive School Counseling Program) - a guide that is used by school counselors in Texas to ensure that all students receive quality programming in all counseling content areas.






# ROLE OF SCHOOL COUNSELOR



**Purpose** - the basic purpose of a school counselor is to support students in their psychological, academic, and social development. Through this support, improvements are seen in student achievement and development.



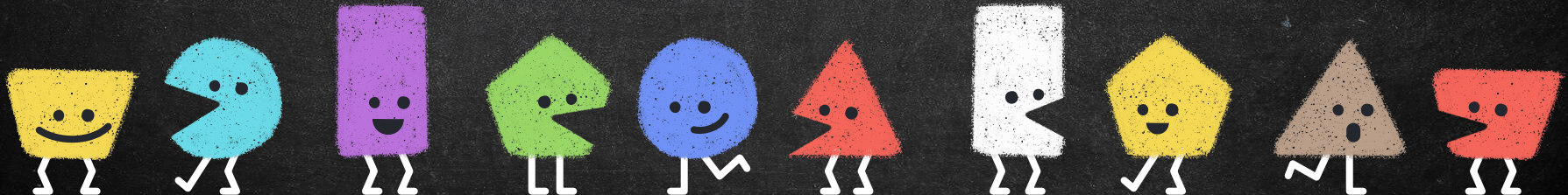
**Scope of Practice** - School Counselors design and deliver school counseling programs to all campus students. They lead, advocate and collaborate with others to connect the counseling program to the school's academic mission and campus improvement plan.

State guidelines require that there are 4 components to any Comprehensive School Counseling Program



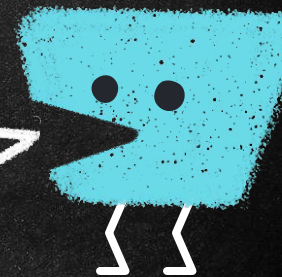


# FOUR COMPONENTS

## Guidance Curriculum

Purpose of the guidance curriculum is to teach students how to develop transferable skills.

The guidance curriculum is taught as units in the classroom through differentiated, developmental learning activities with planned lessons for various sized groups of students.



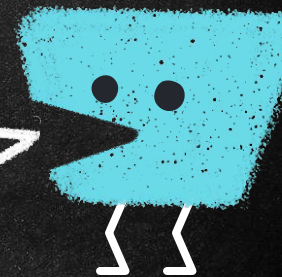


## FOUR COMPONENTS CONT.

### Individual Planning

Purpose is to guide all students as they plan, monitor, and manage their individual educational, career, personal and social development.

The purpose is also to provide parents and guardians information on post-secondary options.



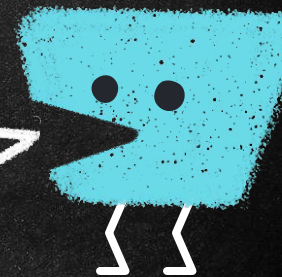


## FOUR COMPONENTS CONT.

### **Responsive Services**

Purpose of this component is to intervene on behalf of students whose immediate personal concerns or circumstances put their continued development at risk.

Based on level of need, responsive services may be preventive, remedial or crisis oriented.



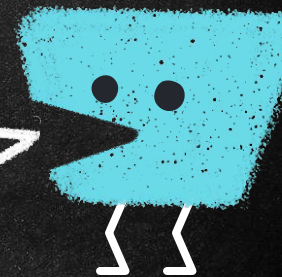


# FOUR COMPONENTS CONT.

## System Support

Purpose of system support is to identify and coordinate resources and activities on campus and in the community that indirectly benefit students.

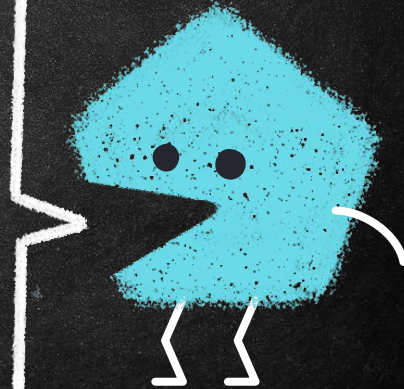
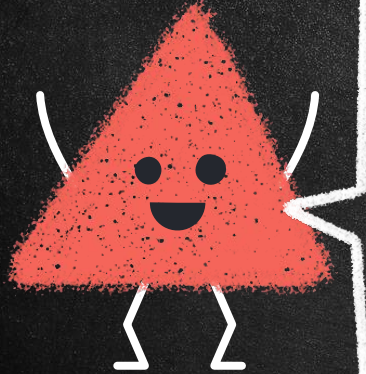
Another purpose is to assess student and campus data to support effective school counseling programs.

## Grade Levels

Program for students in grades K through 5th.

## Curriculum Focus

A series of research-based curricula designed to prevent the likelihood of child victimization by building children's ability to analyze strange or dangerous situations.

Part of a campus' Anti-Victimization programming that is a state requirement for all counseling programs.

## Grade Levels

Program for students in grades K through 2nd.

## Curriculum Focus

# CHARACTER STRONG

## Grade Levels

Program for students in grades K through 5th.

## Curriculum Focus

Character education program that includes in-depth lessons and activities focusing on being kind (Respect, Empathy, Cooperation), being strong (Responsibility, Perseverance, Courage) and being well (Gratitude, Honesty, Creativity).

## Topic

Part of a campus' Character Traits and Personal Skills programming that is a state requirement for all counseling programs.



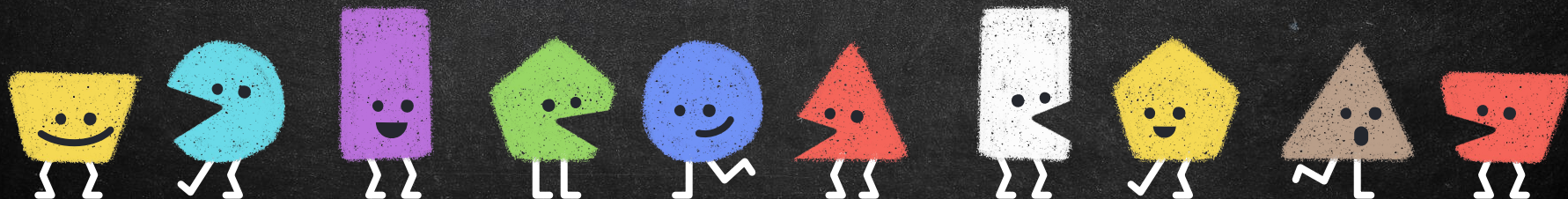
