
Annual Progress and Information Report to Our Community

Graduation Rate

Pequea Valley graduated 96.6% of the 145 students in the 2003 senior class. In tracking student dropouts from 9th through 12th grade, a total of 13 students dropped out of the class, for a grade 9 - 12 graduation rate of 91% for the class of 2003.

Our Faculty and Staff

Professional Qualifications of Our Teachers

The Pequea Valley School District currently employs 145 teachers for grades K-12. All faculty members have the proper college credentials and Department of Education certifications to teach, except one long term substitute currently working under an approved emergency certificate. The state has increased certification requirements for middle school teachers to be "highly qualified" which must be achieved by all schools by the 2006-07 school year. All Pequea Valley teachers in grades 7 and 8 already meet these higher standards. As a result, 99.3 percent of our teachers meet the "highly qualified" definition. All Title I support staff also meet the "highly qualified" standards established for them as well.

"Adequate Yearly Progress"

The PSSA ranks student achievement in Reading, Math, and Writing by using the following quartile labels: below basic, basic, proficient, and advanced. "Adequate Yearly Progress" is the amount of yearly student growth needed so 100 percent of our students will be proficient or advanced by the year 2014. In order for the district to make "Adequate Yearly Progress," each school in the district and any of the disaggregated groups, must continue to grow at a pace that will achieve the goal. Currently, for each building to achieve "Adequate Yearly Progress" the following levels must be achieved:


- * 45% or more of the students must be proficient or advanced in reading.
- * 35% or more of the students must be proficient or advanced in math.
- * As of this printing, the writing criterion has not yet been released.
- * 95% of the overall students as well as each disaggregated sub-group must take the PSSA tests.

It is significant that ALL Pequea Valley schools tested are well above the threshold for achieving AYP!

Disaggregation of PSSA Data

Pennsylvania requires each district to disaggregate PSSA test data for several groups of students. There must be a minimum of 40 students in each group in a school to be reported as a sub-group. The groups include race, ethnicity, gender, disability, migrant status, English proficiency, and economically disadvantaged. Currently, Pequea Valley does not have the required number of students in these classifications, so no disaggregated scores are provided.
